Urinating anywhere other than in the toilets provided.

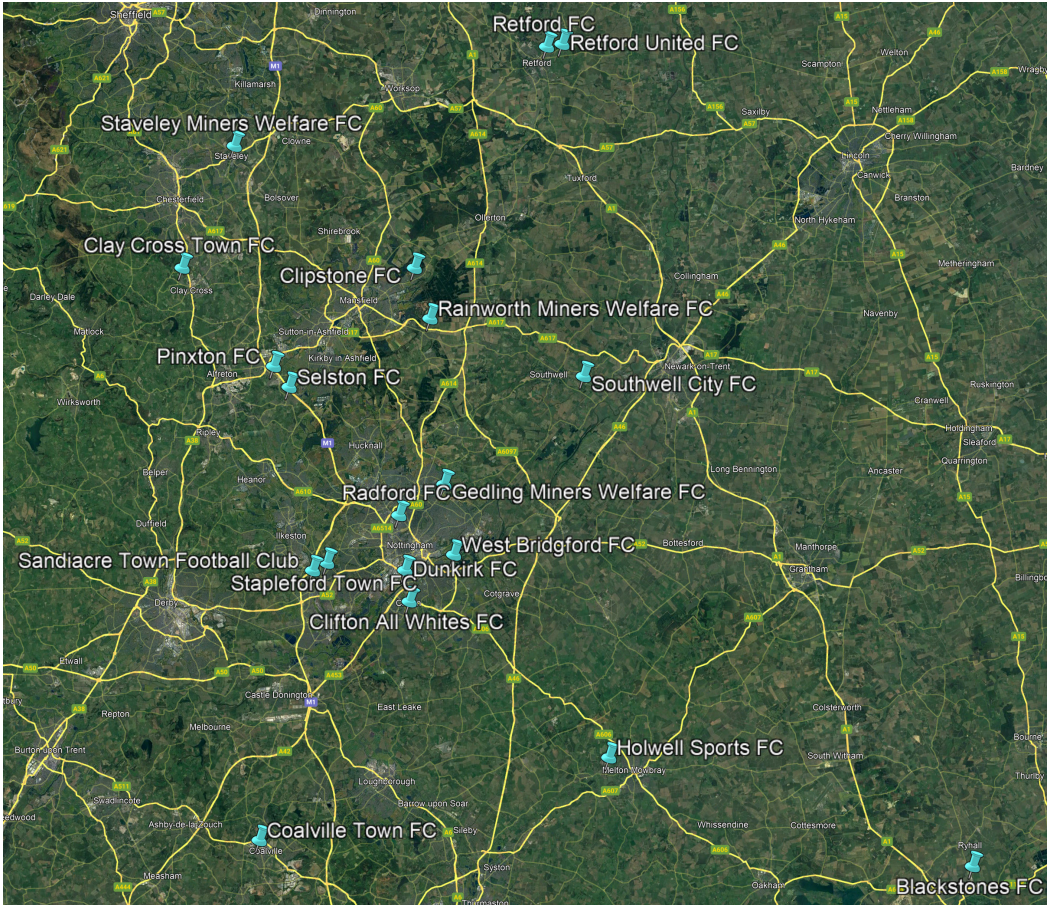
We expect our fans to behave in the correct manner at all times whilst watching our games. Coalville Town FC reserves the right to refuse admission to the ground to any individual or group.

BLACKSTONES FC

FOUNDED: 1920

NICKNAME: THE STONES

The first club with links with Blackstones was the Rutland Ironworks; the club's headquarters were the Half Moon Inn while matches were played on Ryhall Road, Stamford. The first trace of the Ironworks was recorded in 1891, the local press reported them beating Stamford Town Reserves 1-0. By the 1892-93 season the Ironworks were the best team around, dislodging the longer established Town, but in the summer of 1894 the clubs merged.

The Great War was almost over by the time the next Blackstones Club emerged, joining the Peterborough League in 1918 winning the championship that season. However, the club's success, indeed its life was short-lived withdrawing from league the following season. 1921 the club re-emerged under a new name Rutland Engineering Works. The Peterborough League of the twenties was formidable with the likes of Spalding, Bourne and Yaxley. The club opted for more local competitions, in 1929-30 they lined up in both the Stamford Amateur and Deepings Leagues. In 1929-30 they won the championship of both competitions. By 1933 the club again disappeared from the scene.

In 1938 the club by now known as Blackstones returned to action, again playing in two leagues Peterborough and Stamford Amateur Leagues. Both leagues abandoned during the Second World War. In 1949 the club returned to the Peterborough League but in 1951 they re-joined the Stamford Amateur League. 1959 saw them re-join the Peterborough League and this was to last 25 years.

1960-1961 was one of the club's most successful years winning promotion to Division Two and capturing four local cup competitions. Further success followed a year later when the Division Two title was won and promotion to Division One again followed. However, the following season saw them relegated again. 1969 once more saw the club gain promotion back into Division One. 1975-76 the clubs won Division One and along with the improving facilities at Lincoln Road were promoted to the Premier League. The eight seasons at that level saw a best finishing place of fourth in 1977-78. Also during 1978 they were accepted into the FA. Vase for the first time.

In the seventies, the club had established a youth policy under the guidance of Pete Thomas and this was a great success. The best-known player to emerge from this policy was Alan Nelson who was signed by Newcastle United and later transferred to Southampton for a fee of £300,000. In 1984 the club entered senior football by joining the United Counties League Division One. 1987 saw the Stones (as they were now nicknamed) promoted to the Premier Division, finishing runners-up to Northampton Spencer. 1987-88 had also seen Reserves join the UCL.

By 1990 they completed the Double, winning the Reserve Division One title and Reserve Knockout Cup. In 1987 floodlights were installed. The following season the lights were officially opened with Aston Villa sending a strong side to open them, the result being a 2-2 draw. 1991-92 season saw the Stones have an exciting FA. Cup run, beating Bishops Stortford in a First Qualifying Round replay at Lincoln Road 2-0. Stones made their exit in the next round losing by a single goal to Heybridge Swifts. 1992-93 saw the Stones land their first major trophy, the Lincs Senior Cup A. In a dramatic final against Bourne, Stones ran out 2-1 winners after extra time.

Since entering the Premier Division our best finish in that time is 6th place. Since winning the Lincs Cup in 1993 we then reached two further Cup Finals, losing both! 1995 we lost 5-1 to Bedford Town in the Hinchingsbrooke Cup Final at St Neots Town and then in 1997 we lost 3-1 to Glapwell in the Evans Halshaw Floodlit Cup Final at Ilkeston Town. The Stones have had six Chairmen since joining the United Counties League, Andy MacDonald, Bill Sewell, Darren Laughton, Kevin Boor, K.Doyle and Gary Peace. We have also had 12 Managers in that period, Ian Jarvie, Chris Corby, Steve Blades, Dominic Genovese, Vince Adams, Ian Jackson, Mel Landin, Kevin Flynn, Tony Lowther, D.Bird and Joint M. Goode and D. Jarvis, Dave Stratton, Gary Peace, Phil Gadsby and Andy Lodge.

Season 2003-04 proved to be yet another successful one on the "Cup Front" for the Club. Four finals were reached, with the first team "winning" the County Senior 'A Cup for the second time but losing in the Hinchingsbrooke Cup Final. Meanwhile the Reserves went one better in their League Knockout Cup, beating Spalding United in the final but losing in the final of the Ancaster Cup. Both sides improved their position in the League and off the field further improvements were made to Lincoln Road.

2003-2004, 2007-2008 and 2010-2011 seasons all ended with the senior team winning the Lincs Senior Trophy. Season 2012/13 Was dramatic. December 2013 saw managers Jarvis and Goode resign followed by 8 senior players, new manager Dave Stratton, due to financial restraints within the club, could not attract established UCL players with the result that Blackstone's finished in a relegation position. After 23 years in the Premier League Stones were relegated. Season 2013/14 Saw Stones struggling to adapt to Division 1 Football the early Season results were disappointing resulting in a change of Manager, in early September, Dave Stratton was replaced by Chairman Gary Peace. Results improved but not sufficient enough, finishing third from bottom.

Season 2014/15, Gary stood aside for Phil Gadsby who brought in player and the season began to look better, but although reaching the final of the Lincs Trophy, losing on penalties to Winterton Rangers, and Winning the Daniels Cup against Stamford Lions, Stones finished 17th that year. The following season was yet another challenge struggling to string results together finishing mid table, then with results failing to materialise in the 2016/17 season and a poor Christmas period a managerial change took place and Andy Lodge took the reins. Now to see what Andy can achieve in the 2017/18 Season. Mid November Andy Lodge stood down from the position of manager and was succeeded by Dan French and Lee Clarke in a joint role.

Season 2017/18 with Dan and Lee at the helm saw a mixed bag of results as the new management got to grips with the challenges of the UCL, finishing 8th in the league, and once more reaching the final of the Daniels cup and for the second time in 3 years lifted the trophy beating Cottesmore Amateurs 2-1 on the day. The 2018/19 season saw Stones competing in every area and securing a 5th place finish. The 2019/20 season started well, after losing the opening match they went on an 8 game winning streak, stumbled in November before winning the 3 games over Xmas and New Year. From then until mid-March Stones picked up on win losing the rest before Covid-19 brought the season to an abrupt halt. It was then that Dan and Lee left to take up the reins at Deeping Rangers.

After lockdown, Mark Baines took the helm. The FA decided to restructure the league system for 2021/22 and with this going on and us placing an appeal, with 2 weeks to go before the league started, Mark left the role and most of the players left to. We were left with a make shift team and had several unsuccessful management changes. We finished in the relegation positions but had a reprieve to retain Division 1 status. Jon Harrison and Ryan Woods were appointed in 2022/23, and with a new squad guided Blackstones to 8th in the league and reaching the 2nd round proper of the FA Vase. Blackstones are on the Up!

HISTORY OF COALVILLE TOWN FC

FOUNDED: 1926

NICKNAME: RAVENS

MANAGER: ASH BROWN

Coalville Town Football Club were formed in 1926 as Ravenstone Miners Athletic. They were the latest in a long line of association football clubs from the village of Ravenstone - Ravenstone Druids being one of the founder members of the Leicestershire and Rutland County Football Association in 1887. The Ravens played most of their football in the now defunct Coalville & District Amateur League, winning numerous honours including the Division One title on five occasions and the Junior Cup Northern Section on two occasions. Perhaps their greatest triumph came in 1953, when they won the League Championship and the coveted Coalville & District Charity Cup.


When the league folded in 1975, they made the logical move to the North Leicestershire League with equal success. In 1976/77 they were runners-up in both the Premier Division and Cobbin Trophy. They won the Junior Cup in 1985/86, the League Championship in 1989 and the double of Championship and Cobbin Trophy a year later. The Ravens were rewarded for their success on the pitch with election to the Leicestershire Senior League in 1991, following the construction of a new club house at their Ravenslea home. They adapted well to the higher level of football and never finished outside the top half of the Division One table.

The ambitions of the village club far exceeded those of the parish council and, following the council's refusal to grant permission for floodlights, Glyn Rennocks was instrumental in uprooting the club and moving it to Owen Street, Coalville. A change of name followed to Coalville Football Club - with the club becoming the first senior side in the town since the demise of Coalville Amateurs in 1954.

The club commenced their first season as Coalville in 1995/96. Floodlights were installed prior to the 1996/97 season and, after a slow start to the campaign, the first eleven went on to finish as runners up in Division One and gain promotion to the Premier Division. Strength in depth was a major factor during this season with the second eleven going on to win the Leicestershire Combination League Division Two.

The introduction of manager Lee Harriman for the 2001/02 season heralded the most successful period in the club's history. Having led the side to back-to-back Senior League titles, Coalville finally made the step up to the Midland Football Alliance for the 2003/04 season. The 2002/03 season also saw the Under 18s, led by Dan Gallacher, clinching the FA County Youth Cup and finishing as runners up in the League Cup competition. A new era, in a league as tough and prestigious as the Midland Football Alliance, may have seen many a team wilt at their first attempt. However, with a great start from the blocks, the Ravens hit the ground running and finished in a respectable 8th position.

With the emphasis for 2004/05 on finishing as high as possible in the league, with of course aspirations to clinch the title, the squad could have been forgiven for getting a little sidetracked by a certain cup competition - the FA Cup. With Coalville never being eligible for the competition before it was apparent that this would be an experience more than a challenge for the famous cup. However, try telling that to Lee Harriman and his squad. At their first attempt, the club reached the first round proper where they came up against Football League side Wycombe Wanderers, and only bowed out of the competition by a single goal. This was made all the more special as they started in the Extra Preliminary round and became only the second club in the entire history of the Cup to reach the first round proper from the very first stage.



The cup run spurred the team on in the league and, helped by a 17 game unbeaten run, a highest ever finish of 3rd place was achieved.


Coalville began the 2005/06 season as many people's favourites for the MFA but an inconsistent campaign saw the Ravens eventually finish in 8th place. Away from the league Coalville enjoyed a memorable Westerby Cup run which only ended with a 3-2 defeat in the final against Leicester City at the Walkers Stadium. October 2006 saw Lee Harriman bring to an end his five year association with the Ravens and former Nuneaton Borough boss Brendan Phillips was appointed in his place. A difficult season for "The Bear" and Coalville ended with a disappointing 18th place finish and saw Brendan step down from the manager's post in the close-season.

Former player and fans' favourite Adam Stevens was appointed as manager prior to the 2007/08 season and soon set about restoring the Ravens' fortunes. After leading Coalville to eighth, third and second place finishes, along with a narrow League Cup final defeat, Stevens made sure 2011 was a year that will live long in the memory of all Ravens fans. Coalville opened the season with a run of eight victories to underline their status as title favourites but were pushed all the way by Tipton Town with both teams ending the campaign on 100 points. It was Coalville's record-breaking goal-scoring record of 153 goals - exemplified by a final day 9-0 victory at Alvechurch - that made the difference as the Ravens clinched the title and promotion to the Northern Premier League.

For most teams that alone would have been seen as a very successful season but Stevens had loftier ambitions and an outstanding run in the FA Vase saw Coalville book their place in the Wembley final with a 6-2 aggregate victory against Kings Lynn Town. Although Coalville were unfortunate 3-2 losers to Whitley Bay in the final the Ravens made many friends with their open, attacking football. A season of consolidation followed in the Northern Premier League with a high turnover of players in 2011-12. The following season Coalville were top of the Evo-Stik Southern division for most of the season. This great form faltered toward the end of the season with results finishing mainly in draws and losses saw Coalville fall to second in the table behind Kings Lynn. Coalville went on to compete in the play-off semi-final but lost at home to Chasetown. Chasetown went on to lose against Stamford in the final. The Ravens did have some consolation after lifting the Westerby Cup beating Loughborough Dynamo 2-1 in the final at the King Power stadium.

The following season ended in the same way for Coalville but this time it was close all season with players coming impressing and being signed by clubs higher, manager Adam Stevens was really put to the test but continued to find the quality players to push Coalville to the top of the table. A home defeat to Gresley on Easter Monday handed pole position back to Halesowen who secured the title on the last day leaving Coalville again as runners up. This time Mickleover were the visitors to Owen Street for the play-off and a 3-2 defeat left the raven following with that same feeling as the previous season, so near yet so far.... In the FA trophy Coalville had a memorable run beating several higher league teams such as Marine and Solihull Moors before drawing the previous seasons finalists Grimsby Town who were held to a draw at Owen Street before eventually winning through at Blundell park.

Manager Adam Stevens hoped to build on the positive aspects of the last two seasons but soon resigned as manger early on in the season, Jimmy Gray took over for a short spell in charge before Tommy Brookbanks joined from Loughborough with the task of steadying the ship. The Brookbanks era started off with a hard run of games and lots of injuries but the style of football Tommy was to bring to Coalville was soon evident and lifted the spirit of the Raven faithful. Off the pitch was a big year for Coalville as they continued to develop and improve as a club to match the progress of recent years on the pitch, the introduction of the youth development pathway and academy side to hopefully produce local talent for the first team



in the near future. 2014-15 did see a county cup final where the Ravens lost out 2-1 to Barwell at Leicester City's King Power Stadium.


The 2015-16 started off as one of great optimism at Owen St. Tommy Brookbanks had put a squad together capable of challenging for promotion and they got off to a solid start and were never out of the top 3 since September. Acknowledged as probably the best footballing side in the league they were in touch with leaders Stafford, but a wobble in February and March left The Ravens looking over their shoulder. However, an impressive run-in saw Coalville win the promotion play off final at big spending Shaw Lane coming back from being a goal down at half time before running out 3-1 winners following a stunning second half performance. Despite being many people's favourites for relegation The Ravens more than held their own in their first season at Step 3 and finished a creditable 16th Place in their first season in the league.

In the 2017/18 season Coalville had a tough start losing their opening three games but then went on to win the next 7 fixtures pushing them up to 2nd in the league. In November 2017 the club accepted an offer from local law firm Mander Cruickshank who wanted to enter into a long term stadium naming rights agreement with the club. Owen Street Sports Ground became known as The Mander Cruickshank Solicitors Stadium, and that agreement was subsequently renewed multiple times and remains in place today. During the rest of the 2017/18 season there were further runs of losses and victories but all in all was a disappointing league season with the club only just avoiding relegation. The Ravens did reach two cup finals where they defeated Loughborough Dynamo to win the Leicestershire Challenge Cup, but lost to Atherton Collieries in the final of the Integro League Cup. Following the season Manager Tommy Brookbanks left the club and he was replaced by Adam Stevens who joined for his second spell as Manager.

In his first season back Stevens guided the club to 6th place just missing out on the play-offs. The next two years were disrupted by the COVID pandemic and neither was completed. In 2021/22 he assembled an attractive attacking side which finished third in the league before losing out to Peterborough Sports in the play-off final. The 2022/23 season was one of highs and lows for The Ravens. They finished on the same points as eventual champions Tamworth but lost out on the league title by three goals and then lost in the play-offs on penalties to Rushall Olympic. The club had two outstanding cup runs in the season. In the FA Cup 4th qualifying round they beat Notts County 3-2 who at the time were sitting top of the National league. This was their only defeat at home in all competitions in the season. In the first round proper Coalville gave a good account of themselves at former Premier League club Charlton Athletic before losing 4-1. In the FA Trophy they also claimed the scalp of National league promotion chasers Chesterfield.

The 2023/24 season was one of very mixed fortunes for the club both on and off the field. The club was delighted to open its new club shop at the first home game against Leamington, after a sponsorship agreement was reached between the club's Commercial Manager and Stanley Cabin Sales to provide a much larger pre-fabricated shop facility. The club was also proud to announce that work to create and build a new 3G pitch facility behind the stadium would start in the Spring of 2024 bringing many more of the club's youth teams down to the home of the club and ensure that training could carry on in bad weather without the many postponements that had been seen in the preceding years. Whilst the facilities were improved, regrettably the performances on the pitch in the league were inconsistent, with the club finding itself languishing in mid table throughout much of the season.

The club did manage a good cup run, reaching the Quarter Final of the FA Trophy. Having beaten Royston Town, Alvechurch, Boston United, Walsall Wood, Bath City and Bishop's Stortford an attractive Quarter Final was drawn away at Macclesfield. A crowd of 2,510 watched the game which ended with a 3 nil defeat. The club's FA Cup run was less impressive than the previous season, with wins against AFC Telford



and Stafford Rangers, before losing 2 nil to Tamworth in the 3rd Qualifying Round.

In May 2024, after 40 years of involvement with and ownership of Coalville Town FC, Chairman Glyn Rennocks announced he was stepping down from his role at the near-century old club. Mr Rennocks said he could “no longer continue to subsidise the club” as the cost of running it had “spiralled” and “income has not matched the rise in costs”.

Mr Rennocks said in a statement on the club’s website: “I have always said I am a supporter and it just costs me a lot more than most to go to matches. However, as I approach my 70th birthday I can no longer continue to subsidise the club. “I have always run it in a sustainable way, never cut budgets and the club has no debts, however, after much thought and discussions, I have taken the difficult decision to step away. The club will withdraw its men’s senior team and resign from the Southern League with immediate effect.

His statement suggested both his and the club’s relationship with the council had recently declined, and that he believed he had come under an unprecedented level of “scrutiny”. Mr Rennocks said: “I feel this is totally unwarranted given the positive impact I and the club have had on the town, providing a facility and structure for almost 900 local children through our 90 junior teams to enjoy football coaching in a safe and healthy environment, along with painting the town in a positive light through our success that has received nationwide publicity.”

Paul Stone, director of resources at North West Leicestershire District Council, said: “We would like to thank Glyn for many years of contribution to the Coalville community through his role as Chairman of Coalville Town FC, and commit to continuing our work with the club in supporting health and wellbeing for the town. As is the case for councils up and down the country, we are having to look very closely at our budgets in an effort to remove a predicted gap of £4 million. “As such, the decision was made by councillors during this year’s budget-setting process to reduce our grant to a number of organisations – including Coalville Town FC. It is against a difficult financial backdrop and preserving our own services for our residents that we need to propose changes like this.”

At the end of the 2023–24 season the club withdrew from the Southern League.

Within hours of the club withdrawing from the Southern League, a number of club officials met to plan an immediate return to first team football for the club and to ensure that the 98 year old club would reach its centenary. An application was lodged with the FA to rejoin three divisions lower than where Coalville Town had previously been competing. Several key sponsors confirmed their desire to help the club and continue assisting the club and a crowd funding page was set up with the aim of raising £5,000. The application to the FA was accepted and the club has subsequently joined Division One of the United Counties League.

On the 4th June 2024 the Ravens announced that the manager will be club legend Ash Brown, with coaches Jason Weafer and David Clay. It was felt the club needed someone with coaching experience, but also someone with a strong affinity to the club. Ash made over 500 appearances for the Ravens and was captain when the team played Whitley Bay in the 2011 FA Vase final at Wembley Stadium. 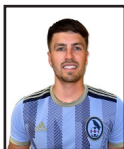

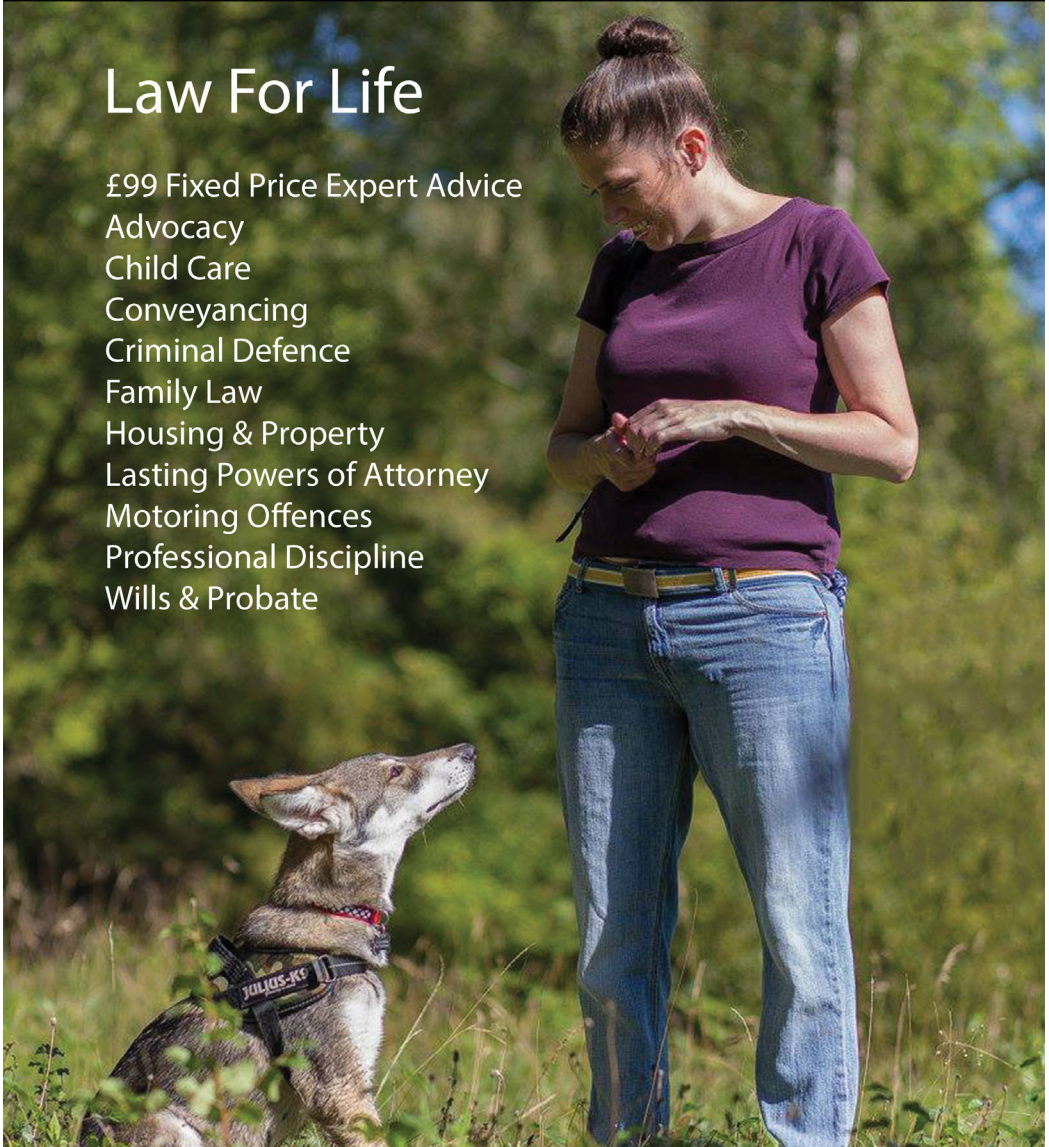
