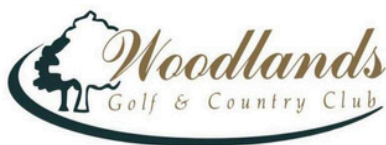

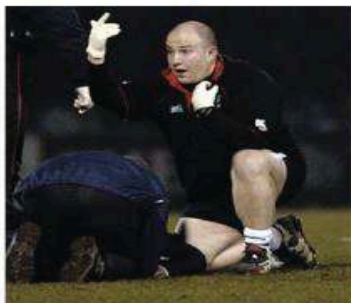

# Our History

Cribbs Football Club was founded in London in 1958 as Sun Life Assurance. The Bristol team was established in 1976 when Sun Life first relocated to Bristol. Initially, two teams were run, participating in the Bristol and Avon League, playing at Dundridge Farm. However, when the Cribbs Causeway ground was opened in 1978, the first team were promoted straight to the Avon Premier Combination League (later renamed Bristol Premier Combination) where they stayed for 20 years until they eventually won promotion to the County League in 1999-2000.

In the summer of 2011, the club changed its name from AXA to Cribbs Friends Life FC ready for the 2011-12 season. The season was Cribbs' most successful season to date as the club claimed its first Gloucestershire County League title on the way to an unprecedented League and Cup double. The team later adding the Les James League Cup to the League Championship and in the process becoming the first and only side to achieve this feat.

As a result of winning the league, the club earned promotion to the Western League Division One for the 2012-2013 subsequently changing their name to simply, Cribbs FC.

Cribbs were promoted into the Western League Premier Division for the commencement of the 2015-2016 season and obtained numerous top half finishes until at the end of the 2020-21 season the club were transferred to the Premier Division of the Hellenic League.

Under the stewardship of Richard Luffman, Cribbs in his first full season in charge, recorded a best ever Step Five position of fourth in the Hellenic League. They also were winners of the League Cup defeating Hereford Pegasus 1-0 through a George Kellow goal.

Cribbs gained Southern League status in 2023 after becoming champions of the Hellenic League, clinching promotion with a 1-0 win over Wantage Town with a match to spare.

2023/2024 was the first season in the Southern League and saw a third placed finish and a play-off for promotion to the Premier Division, where we lost 2-1 against local rivals Bristol Manor Farm.

Our second season at Step 4 proved a tougher proposition to the first, finishing in relegation places and as a result returning to the Hellenic League.

Since its inception the club has run multiple sides across the Bristol Premier Combination and Bristol & District League. The Reserve Team won the Premier Combination in 2021/2022 season and did so in numerous seasons prior. They were granted entry to the Gloucestershire County League for 2022/2023.

In their first season in the GCL they finished six points in front of Bromley Heath United to clinch the title and earn promotion to the Toolstation Western League Division One.

The Reserves finished sixth in the Western League Division One in 2023/2024 and twelfth in 2024/2025. For 2025/2026 season they return to the Gloucestershire County League, keeping the requisite number of divisions between themselves and the 1<sup>st</sup> XI.

# League Review

## Sharpness win battle at top

County Cup week, but we had two League games including the two 100% teams meeting each other, which, rather surprisingly Sharpness won a mostly one-sided affair. Tewkesbury Town picked up their first point of the season. In the County Cup it was the end of the road for Wick, Totterdown United and Hanham Athletic, all falling to lower league opposition.

At the Bell Field the top two **Frampton United** and **Sharpness** met in a local derby with Sharpness coming out convincing winners. Sharpness started the game the better of the two and James Tainton had a good chance early on but shot straight at Tom Kaye. Against the run of play Frampton opened the scoring on the half hour when a free kick into the box was partially cleared was played back in to Jacob Geddes who neatly turned his defender to score. Frampton then had the better of the game up to half time. Sharpness started the second period strongly and equalised in the 5<sup>th</sup> minute when a short corner was played in to the back post for Michael Bryant to head in. With the wind in their sails Sharpness took the lead on the hour, a good ball was played out wide for Will Payne to run on to and shoot past Kaye. On 65 minutes the match was well and truly turned on its head when a Bryant free kick was pushed out by Kaye and Callum Dummelow was first to react for 3-1. The Sharks fourth came a minute later, another short corner and Brad Gibbs headed in. On 75 minutes a James Tainton strike made it 5-1 before Harry Churchley's long range strike pulled one back for the hosts, but Sharpness took the three points 5-2.

At Northway Playing Fields **Tewkesbury Town**, without any League points hosted unbeaten **Filton Athletic**. It was a game of two very different halves. Town dominated the first half in large spells and went in 1-0 up with Jamie Goodwin slotting in a 1-on-1 after a long clearance from Lorcan Sheehan. Town started the second half well but Filton grew into the match attacking with intent and pushing the home defence deeper. They equalised on 70 minutes from a Kyle Thomas header with the defence failing to clear. With ten minutes to go Town were reduced to ten for a high challenge allowing Filton to push on for the final stage. Tewkesbury defended their box well and frustrated an organised Filton to gain their first point of the season 1-1.

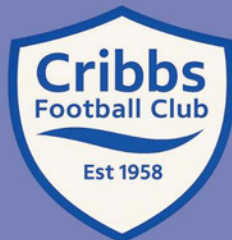

THERE can't be many clubs with a better record of producing players fit for the EFL – and higher – than FC Halifax Town.

The number that have passed through the Shay down the years is quite something.

Our Chris Dunlavy, chief writer on sister title The Football League Paper, caught up with a former Shaymen last week after he called time on his career.

One of the privileges of this job is watching young footballers thrive in Non-League before getting their chance and then carving out a successful career in the higher levels.

Lee Gregory certainly did that, scoring 112 EFL goals for the likes of Millwall, Stoke, Sheffield Wednesday and Mansfield Town.

The striker began his journey at Staveley Miners Welfare and Sheffield FC and Glapwell before ripping it up at FC Halifax Town – alongside a certain Jamie Vardy.

But Gregory still remembers the conversation he had with Nicky Law during a brief spell on trial at Alfreton two decades ago.

"I was 17 or 18 and Nicky was the manager at Alfreton," he recalls. "He said to me one day, 'You don't have to be a professional. You can have a good career in Non-League. Get a job, do this on the side, put the extra money towards a house and you'll pay it off in 15 or 20 years'.

"I remember thinking 'You know, he's right'. That was my mentality when I was playing for Staveley Miners Welfare and Sheffield FC and Glapwell.

"By the time I got to 23, when I joined Halifax, I was like 'OK, this is my life - let's buy that house and stop dreaming'."

Thankfully for Gregory, now 37, an intervention from Kim Holloway - wife of Ian - changed the course of his life.

Gregory scored 29 National League goals for Halifax in the 2013-14 campaign. Holloway, then in charge of Millwall, was considering making an offer but feared the forward would struggle with the jump to the Championship.

"You could be the best player in the world but if you've not got the right opinion behind you, you're not going to go anywhere," says Gregory.

"It only takes one person to believe in you and in my case it was Ian's wife. She was the one who said 'Go on, why don't you take a chance on the lad from Non-League?' That one opinion changed my life.

"I did have other clubs in the pipeline. I was always going to end up in the EFL that summer. But none of them were in the Championship. I know you make your own luck, but you need help along the way. I was very lucky that she said that to him, and that he listened to her." Gregory is just another example of how different players will take different routes into the Football League. We're lucky we get to see a lot of them at before they really make it.

# HANHAM ATHLETIC F.C.

## CLUB HISTORY

Hanham Athletic FC is one of the oldest clubs in the Bristol Area. The Gloucestershire Football Association recognizes the club as being founded in 1896, but the Club's establishment is believed to have been much earlier. During the 19th Century Hanham was a small mining village boarding the South East of Bristol and in the club's early days the players lived locally, many of them coming to play straight from a shift in the pits. A tradition and history which is still recognized today is the club's nickname "The Miners".

We are a committee led Community Amateur Sports Club that manages men's football teams across a number of leagues, leases and maintains the sports pavilion and grounds of Hanham Athletic FC – titled The Hallett Construction Pavilion (see advert in programme for further details). Over the years we have offered the opportunity for regular football to thousands of boys and men, with c.100 signing on to our books each year. We were founder members of the Gloucester County League in the late 1960s and have previously been very successful playing county league football for many years with a proud history of honors and promotions. We run our First, Reserves, A Teams and Under 18's (new for the 2024/2025 season) and operate a talented Sunday Team. We have, in the past, won awards for our ground work and programmes.

We, many years ago played in the FA Cup, almost getting to Wembley, as well as the FA Vase during the 1970s. In 1980 the club started its own Charity Shield Competition running tournaments with teams participating and we continue to run tournaments and charity events every year. We are a family friendly club, with a strong social following, a determination to support people, and a huge passion for football.

During the 2022/2023 season our 1st Team under the management team of Tom Morgan (Skinney) and Jason Side (Sider) won the Bristol & District Premier Division, the League Cup Final Winners (April 2023) and Les James Cup (2023). Winning the league saw HAFC promoted back into the Marcliff County League. Under the same management team with Craig Sperring (ex-player) joining Skinney and Sider, we finished 7th in the league and competed in two cup finals .... Unfortunately, we were runners up on both occasions.

For the 2024/2025 season we had a new management team of Paul Coles (Noddy) and Jamie Johnson (Rabbzy) taking charge of the First Team following the departure of Skinney and Sider to Avonmouth FC. T

During the closed season of the 2024/2025 season we have had some management changes:

- 1st Team - 2025/2026 Season will see Jamie Johnson (Rabbzy) with the assistance of Harmen Boyce (Boyce) as 1st Team Managers
- Reserves - 2025/2026 will be managed by Dan Cole with the assistance of Steven Thomson - their first season at HAFC
- A Team - 2025/2026 will be managed by Scott Johnson and Jason Golding
- Youth Teams - we are very excited to have U9, U11, U14 and U18 teams at Hanham Athletic and we look forward to providing updates throughout the season.

Dan Sperring (Vice Chairman) has decided to step down from his position on the Committee due to work and family commitments. Dan is still an avid supporter of the Club and no doubt you will still see him around the facilities. Thank you Dan for your hard work and dedication over the last couple of years.

We would like to welcome Dan Finn as the new Vice Chair to HAFC - welcome to the family.





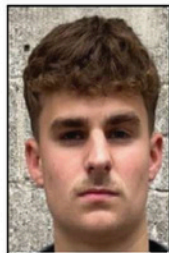
