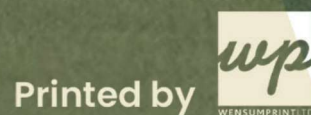

LAST TIME OUT

MULBARTON WANDERERS VS DEREHAM TOWN

Mulbarton Wanderers 3 - 1 First Team
Away | 02 August 2025

Dereham made an edgy start being unable to keep possession. A perfectly timed challenge by skipper Sam Watts thwarted a Mulbarton attack. In the 8th minute a hotheaded challenge by Jesse Fenn in the box gave Mulbarton a stone wall penalty. Magpies keeper Charlie Congreve went the right way but Ashley Jarvis's spot kick contained too much power and gave the hosts an early lead. Dereham won two free kicks that George Sturrock-Watts lifted into the home box but were cleared. Mulbarton's Owen Lane then had a clear sight of goal but blazed over from 20 yards. Dereham were looking totally unorganised. Fenn picked up Mac Gee's header and burst into the box before defender Tom Hunter made a great saving tackle. Keeper Congreve made a fine low save from Lane as play switched ends. Another fine challenge by Watts denied Ryan Crisp as the home side threatened again. Dereham won a corner in the 37th minute with a flowing passing move. Home keeper Tom Wright struggled with Jamie North's delivery with the ball coming back out to North who lifted it again towards the danger area. The keeper made a mess of the second centre and Jesse Fenn knocked home the loose ball from close range for the equaliser. The Magpies were suddenly lifted and Fenn was blatantly pushed in the box but the referee ignored Dereham's appeals. North tested the home defence with a free kick from the left. It was all square at the break.

After the restart Mulbarton won a free kick on the left with Gee's half clearance falling to Miguel Lopez who shot over the top when well placed. Charlie Barber had another chance for the home side but fired straight into Congreve's arms. Dereham then missed a great opportunity to go in front. Gee played a superb pass to North on the byline and his cross reached the unmarked Micheal Ellis who failed to net from close range. The Magpies were made to pay in the 57th minute when a misplaced pass by Watts gave Mulbarton possession in the box and the ball was played to Ashley Jarvis who netted with a low drive for his second of the game and to regain the home side's lead. In the 63rd minute Dereham introduced new signed Luke Middleton. Rhys Logan also replaced the injured Fenn. Gee was then dismissed for a second yellow card by the card happy referee in the 72nd minute. Charlie Palmer had a shot charged down before keeper Wright claimed Logan's centre. In the 79th minute Mulbarton were awarded another penalty following a poor challenge by Toby Oliver. Ashley Jarvis stepped up to covert again and complete his hat-trick. Mulbarton progressed to the next round with the referee spoiling the match with his inconsistent decisions throughout.

OUR STORY...

The club was founded as Dereham Football Club in 1884, spending many of its early years in the Dereham & District League. In 1891–92 the club reached the final of the Norfolk Senior Cup, losing to CEYMS. By 1910 the club were playing in the Norwich & District League and had been renamed East Dereham. In 1920 they adopted their current name and in 1935 they joined the Norfolk & Suffolk League, which had lost several clubs to the newly established Eastern Counties League. When the Norfolk & Suffolk League merged into the Anglian Combination, the club were placed in the Senior B Division. They won the division at the first attempt and were promoted Premier Division. They were renamed Dereham Hobbies United in 1986 after a local Sunday league team merged into the club. The club were relegated from the Premier Division at the end of the 1988–89 season, but made an immediate return to the Premier Division as Division One champions. In 1991 they returned to the name Dereham Town.

In 1997–98 Dereham won the Anglian Combination Premier Division, earning promotion to Division One of the Eastern Counties League, also winning the Don Frost Memorial Cup. In 2001–02 the club finished second in Division One, beating Stanway Rovers 1–0 on the final day to overtake them and earn promotion to the Premier Division. The club won the Norfolk Senior Cup in 2006, defeating Norwich United 1–0 in the final, and again in 2007 when Wroxham were beaten 1–0 in the final. In 2012–13 they won the Eastern Counties League Premier Division, earning promotion to Division One North of the Isthmian League. The club won the Norfolk Senior Cup for the fourth time in 2015–16, defeating Norwich United 2–0 in the final. A fifth Senior Cup was won in 2018–19, when Dereham beat Thetford Town 2–1 in the final.

In 2022 Dereham were transferred to Division One Midlands of the Northern Premier League. After finishing fourth-from-bottom of the division in 2022–23 they were relegated back to the Premier Division of the Eastern Counties League.

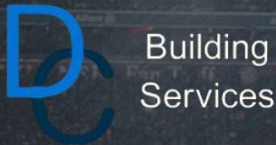

THEIR STORY...

Founded in 1886, Haverhill Rovers have a long and proud history in English grassroots football. The club originally played at Seven Acres before moving to Hamlet Croft in 1913, where they built their reputation over many decades. Their early years saw spells in regional leagues, including the East Anglian League in 1908/09 and the Essex & Suffolk Border League from the 1920s, which they rejoined in 1935. After finishing runners-up in 1946/47, they lifted both the league title and Knock-Out Cup the following season – a sign of things to come.

The 1960s marked a golden era, with back-to-back league wins and a second “double” in 1963/64. That same year, Rovers joined the Eastern Counties League (ECL), finishing sixth in their debut season and winning the League Cup. Despite struggling in the early 1970s, the club was crowned ECL champions in 1978, beating Great Yarmouth Town to the title. A record crowd of 1,300 attended the decisive match at Hamlet Croft.

Although league titles were hard to come by afterward, the 1980s and 1990s saw cup success and solid league finishes. In 1986/87, Rovers made a memorable run to the FA Vase quarter-finals, drawing over 1,500 fans to the Croft. They also lifted the East Anglian Cup in 1991 and the Cambridgeshire Invitation Cup three times. After a tough season in 1995/96 led to their first-ever relegation, Rovers bounced back by winning the Suffolk Senior Cup in 1997.

The 2000s were a mix of challenges and high points. The club won the First Division Knock-Out Trophy three times and made national headlines in the 2006/07 FA Cup, beating Conference South side Eastbourne Borough in front of 504 fans. The run ended in the fourth qualifying round against Aldershot, drawing a record crowd of 1,730.

Promotion back to the Premier Division came in 2007. By 2010, the club moved to a new, purpose-built home: The New Croft. The new ground ushered in a fresh era – including an impressive 8th-place finish in their debut season there. In 2013/14, under Dean Greygoose, Rovers sat second at Christmas and finished 7th despite a string of injuries.

The following years were more turbulent, with relegation from the Premier Division in 2022 after 17 years at that level. However, the club remained resilient. Former manager and player Ben Cowling returned, taking over mid-season and leading a young squad to a 10th-place finish in 2023. Building on that progress, Rovers sealed the league title in March 2024, three games before season’s end, marking a return to the Eastern Counties Premier Division.

With a modern stadium, a thriving youth system, and a renewed sense of ambition, Haverhill Rovers are once again aiming to rise – both on and off the pitch.

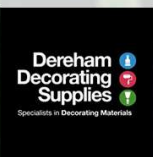
