PRIVACY POLICY

Thames Valley Premier League (**League**) ("we", "our", "us") take your privacy very seriously.

This Privacy Notice sets out how we use and look after the personal information we collect from you. We are the data controller, responsible for the processing of any personal data you give us. We take reasonable care to keep your information secure and to prevent any unauthorised access to or use of it.

What personal data we hold on you

Personal data means any information about an individual from which that individual can be identified.

We collect, use, store and transfer some personal data of our participants [and their parents or guardians], and other League members.

You provide information about yourself and your members when you register with the League, and by filling in forms at an event or online, or by corresponding with us by phone, e-mail or otherwise.

The information you give us may include name, date of birth, address, e-mail address, phone number, gender, and the contact details of a third party in the case of emergency. We may also ask for relevant health information, which is classed as special category personal data, for the purposes of health, wellbeing, welfare and safeguarding. Where we hold this data it will be with the explicit consent of the participant or, if applicable, the participant's parent or guardian.

Where we need to collect personal data to fulfil League responsibilities and you do not provide that data, we may not be able honour or administer your registration.

Why we need your personal data

We will only use personal data for any purpose for which it has been specifically provided.

The reason we need participants' and members' personal data is to be able to run the football league and arrange matches; to administer registration, and provide the league services you are signing up to when you register with the League as a club or participant. Our lawful basis for processing this personal data is that we have a contractual obligation to anyone as a participant or member to provide the services they are registering for.

We have set out below, in a table format, a description of all the ways we plan to use personal data, and which of the legal bases we rely on to do so. We have also identified what our legitimate interests are where appropriate.

sharing data with committee members to provide information about league activities, registration renewals or invitation to social events	The League has a legitimate interest to maintain participant correspondence for league community purposes.

sharing data with third party service or facility providers	The League has a legitimate interest to run the organisation efficiently and as it sees fit. Provision of some third party services is for the benefit of the League and participants.
sharing anonymised data with a funding partner as condition of grant funding e.g. Local Authority	The League has a legitimate interest to run the organisation efficiently and as it sees fit. Application for funding is a purpose that benefits the League and participants.
publishing match and league results	Consent. We will only publish personal data in a public domain, including images and names, if we have your consent for us to do so. In the case of children under the age of 13 then only with written consent of parent/guardian
sending out marketing information such as newsletters and information about promotions and offers from sponsors	Consent. We will only send direct marketing if you are an existing member, participant or other associated individual and you have not previously objected to this marketing, or, you have actively provided your consent.
to ensure we understand possible health risks	Consent. We will only process details on anyone medical history with their consent.

Who we share your personal data with

When you register with the League, your information, if you are a coach or volunteer will be or if you are another participant may be entered onto the Whole Game System database, which is administered by the FA. We also pass your information to the County FA/ FA for affiliation purposes.

We may share personal data with selected third parties, suppliers and sub-contractors such as, coaches or match organisers. Third-party service providers will only process your personal data for specified purposes and in accordance with our instructions.

We may disclose personal information to third parties to comply with a legal obligation; or to protect the rights, property, or safety of our participants, members or affiliates, or others.

The League's data processing may require personal data to be transferred outside of the UK. Where the League does transfer personal data overseas it is with the sufficient appropriate safeguards in place to ensure the security of that personal data.

Protection of your personal data

We have put in place appropriate security measures to prevent personal data from being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered or disclosed.

How long we hold your personal data

We keep personal data on our participants while they continue to be a participant or are otherwise actively involved with the League. We will delete this data twenty four (24) months after a participant has left or otherwise ended their registration or affiliation, or sooner if specifically requested and we are able to do so. We may need to retain some personal data for longer for legal or regulatory purposes. The personal data that is stored on Whole Game System is subject to the FA's privacy policy so we advise you review that policy together with this notice. If anyone would like their personal data to be deleted from Whole Game System then please contact the County FA.

Your rights regarding your personal data

As a data subject participants may have the right at any time to request access to, rectification or erasure of their personal data; to restrict or object to certain kinds of processing of their personal data, including direct marketing; to the portability of their personal data and to complain to the UK's data protection supervisory authority, the Information Commissioner's Office about the processing of their personal data.

As a data subject participants are not obliged to share their personal data with the League. If they choose not to share their personal data with us we may not be able to register them with the League.

We may update this Privacy Notice from time to time and will inform you to any changes in how we handle personal data.

CLUBS CHARTER

- Confirm the match with the referee at least five days before the game (see Rule 20 (C))
- Have a club member meet the referee when he or she arrives present referee with two clean match balls in his dressing room before the match
- All Premier League & BTC Senior cup matches - team sheet to referee & opposition at least **30 minutes** prior to kick-off (Rule 20 (A), and 10 minutes for all other divisions and BTC Intermediate and Junior cup matches (Rule 20 (A))
- Inform the referee the names of substitutes before the kick-off (max 5)
- Thank the referee & shake his hand after the match (even if he didn't do as well as you would have liked)
- Pay the match officials their fees immediately after the match (Rule 23 (E))
- Text results to: FA Full Time (Rule 21 (B))
- Complete team details, goals, substitutes, discipline, on Full Time within two days. (see Rule 21 (A))

REFEREES CHARTER

- Keep referees secretary informed of available dates
- Arrive at the match at least 45 minutes (One hour for Premier Division & BTC Senior Cup) prior to kick-off
- Check the pitch & goal / nets prior to kick-off
- Premier Division / BTC Senior cup matches- check the rope is correctly erected and all around the pitch
- Note .:ALL Premier matches must be 90 minutes in duration, include evening matches – FA Rule.
- Pre match instruction to club assistant referees well before kick off. Thank them after the game
- Start the match at designated kick-off time. Report team responsible for late starts. (remember seven players constitute a team)
- Complete the referees result form on web after the match, www.refsreport.com

SECRETARIES' INFORMATION

The efficient administration of the League Rules by the club secretaries is to the advantage of all concerned. Any secretary, particularly those new to the role, who experience difficulties should contact the General Secretary who will be pleased to offer helpful advice.

The following notes are for the guidance of all club secretaries.

Correspondence

All correspondence to be sent to admin@thamesvalleypremierleague.co.uk. Correspondence from the clubs to be sent by the clubs nominated officers only as stated on its League Membership form and not from team managers or players. (Rule 5(E)).

Confirmation of match

The home club must confirm full particulars of the match including club colours with the opposing team at least five days prior to the match. (Rule 20 (C)).

When engaged in cup ties you must notify your opponents, the Fixtures Secretary and Referees' Secretary

NOTE: it is mandatory that the away club acknowledges the home teams' confirmation.

Club colours

In the event of both teams having the same or similar colours, it is the responsibility of the **away club** to change (Rule 19). Note: Rule 19 is applicable to shirts, shorts and socks.

Referees

It is the responsibility of the home club to confirm with the appointed Referee the match details five days prior to the match.

Kick off times

The current times of kick off for Saturday league matches shall be 2.00 pm, unless agreed by all parties involved and the League Management Committee also where all or part is played under floodlights. Midweek league matches shall kick off at 6.00 pm or no later than 7.45 pm where played under floodlights, subject to all parties and League Management Committee agreement.

The current times of kick off for Berkshire Trophy Centre Cup matches (excluding final ties) shall be:

- ◆ Saturday kick-offs for November, December and January, 1.30 pm
- ◆ Saturday kick-offs for other months, 2.00 pm

Confirmation of pitch

Home clubs when playing on public park pitches must confirm the booking of their pitch at least 48 hours before the match with the appropriate local Council.

Postponed fixtures

Where a match is postponed due to inclement weather (or other reasons) the home club is responsible for advising:

- a) The League Fixture Secretary and Referees' Secretary
- b) The opposing team
- c) The referee & assistant referees, where appointed

This action should be taken as early as possible to avoid unnecessary inconvenience (see Rule 20 E(iii)). Failure to do so will result in a fine.

Postponement notification on the day of the match must be made by TELEPHONE to all parties.

Note

The practice of playing first team players in Reserve / A / B Team matches when the first team does not have a game, is unsporting and unfair. Clubs are asked to refrain from this kind of gamesmanship.

Team Sheet

In all League and BTC Cup matches it is the responsibility of both competing teams to provide the match referee with the players' names completed on an official team sheet (Rule 20 (A)).

Immediately after each match (including all Cup matches), it is the responsibility of both clubs to text the result of their match to FA Full Time Website. (Rule 21(B)).

Please note, controversial news should not be given, but raised with the Officers of the League.

Summary for Saturday matches

Monday – Confirm with opponents and officials

Tuesday – Confirm pitch with council (if park pitch), where required to do so

Saturday – Text result to FA Full Time Website to be received 5.00 p.m.

Saturday – Complete and send Team Result Form via FA Full Time Website

Secretary's details

Any changes to the club Secretary's details during the season must be sent to the General Secretary immediately.

External cup matches

External cups draws to be notified to League General Secretary by clubs as soon as known.

Guidance to the marking of referees

Assaults on referees

The league will not tolerate any assault or verbal abuse by players or club officials on any appointed referee or substitute referee. Any such action will be viewed very seriously by the appropriate county football association.

Foul / abusive language

The use of foul and/or abusive language by players, club officials or followers will not be tolerated by the league. Clubs or individuals reported for using foul / abusive language will be subject to disciplinary action.

Below is a summary of the rules of the Competition relevant to referees. For full details refer to the appropriate rule in the rules section of this book.

Fees

Divisions Two - Four inc and Intermediate & Junior Cups up to quarter finals	£34.00	£34.00
Intermediate and Junior Cups – semi finals	£38.00	£34.00

The home team shall pay the officials their fees on the day of the match, in their dressing room within a quarter of an hour after the conclusion of the match. Rule 23(E). In the Premier Division the home club is responsible for paying the three match officials. The away club reimburse the home club the cost of one assistant referee.

In the event of a match not being played because of circumstances over which the clubs have no control, the officials, if present, shall be entitled to half fees, but where a match is not played owing to one club being in default, that club shall pay the officials, if they attend the ground, their full fee. Rule 23(F).

Kick-off time

The times of kick off for league matches shall be 2.00 pm on Saturdays and 6.00 pm for evening matches (non lights) and no later than 7.45 pm (lights).

The times of kick off for Berkshire Trophy Centre Cup matches (excluding final ties) shall be:

- ◆ Saturday kick-offs for November, December and January, 1.30 pm
- ◆ Saturday kick-offs for other months, 2.00 pm

The Referee shall at his discretion wait up to half-an-hour after the appointed kick-off time for the arrival of a team, before deciding the match cannot take place. For evening fixtures, the Referee has complete discretion.

Match confirmation

The Secretary of the home club must give notice in writing, or telephone, of full particulars of situation of ground, time of kick-off, colours and means of reaching the ground to the appointed Officials at least five days prior to the playing of the match. Failure of the home club to do so should be reported to the League Secretary. Rule 20 (C). The Away club shall acknowledge the match confirmation.

Team Sheet

In all League matches and BTC Cup ties, it is the responsibility of both competing teams to provide the match Referee with the players' names completed on an official Team Sheet, 30 minutes before Kick-off Premier Division and BTC Senior Cup and 10 minutes before kick-off all other divisions and BTC Intermediate and Junior Cups. Rule 20 (A).

Duration

All Premier Division matches to be 90 minutes (45 minutes each way) – FA Standard Code Rule.

The maximum time to be played in Division One – Four league matches shall be 90 minutes (45 minutes each way) and the minimum shall be 60 minutes (30 minutes each way).

The half-time interval shall not exceed 15 minutes and should be a minimum of 5 minutes.

In cup-ties the period of time shall be the same but in the event of scores being equal at the end of normal period; extra time shall be played which will not exceed 15 minutes, nor less than 10 minutes each way, at the discretion of the Referee (no discretion if the game is played under floodlights). If the tie is drawn after extra time, then the match will be settled by TAKING KICKS FROM THE PENALTY MARK in accordance with International Board Procedures.

Colours

Goalkeepers must wear a colour which distinguishes them from other players and the referee. **No player, including the goalkeeper, must not wear black or very dark shirts or jerseys.** Rule 19.

The League requires all referees to wear black shirts, shorts and socks.

In the event of a clash of colours (shirts, shorts and/or socks) the away team shall change. Any team not having a change of colours or delaying the kick-off by not having a change should be reported to the League Secretary. Rule 19.

In a BTC cup semi-finals or final tie, should the colours of the competing teams be similar, both teams must change. Rule 24 (J).

Numbers

Teams must wear numbered shirts; each player shall the number on the team sheet. Rule 19. Breach of the rule should be reported to the League Secretary.

Late kick offs

Referees must order teams to commence at the time appointed if possible (**REFEREES ARE ADVISED THAT TEAMS CAN KICK-OFF WITH 7 PLAYERS**).

The referee should advise the captain of the offending team that his club is to be reported for a late start and should ensure that the late kick off is recorded with a note of the responsible team on the Referee's match result card.

The home team must provide two footballs* fit for play. The referee shall advise the team captain of his intention to report if the home team fail to provide two balls and report the breach to the League Secretary. Rule 20 (A).

* throughout the League the footballs to be used are as approved by the management committee.

Result forms

A match report shall be fully completed within 48 hours of completion of the match (excluding Sundays) on the online website www.refsreport.com Rule 23 (J).

Referees' Assistants (Linesmen)

Registered Referees and Referees' Assistants shall be appointed by the Referees' Appointments Secretary where possible. In all matches where no appointment is made it is the responsibility of each team to appoint a Club Assistant Referee for each match. Failure to do so should be reported to the League Secretary. Rule 23(C).

In Premier Division matches a nominated substitute is not eligible to be a Club Assistant Referee.

In the event of the non-appearance of the appointed Referee, the senior appointed Referee's Assistant shall take charge and a substitute Linesman appointed. The appointed Referee who is late on arrival shall take over the game and not re-start it. In such cases the Referee is entitled to his fee.

Non-Appearance

A Referee or Referee's Assistant NOT KEEPING AN APPOINTMENT and failing to give satisfactory explanation for non-appearance, may have his name removed from the list of Referees, and the fact reported to the County Football Association with whom he/she is registered. Rule 23 (G).

Ground

The Referee shall have the power to decide as to the fitness of the ground in all matches and his/her decision shall be final (subject to Rule 23 (D)).

No objection relative to the dimensions of the ground, goal posts, bars or other appurtenances of the game shall be entertained by the League Council unless a protest is lodged with the Referee before the commencement of the match and reported to the Hon. General Secretary within Seven days. The Referee MUST report the protest lodged with him to the League Secretary. Rule 7 (A)(ii).

GUIDE TO MARKING MATCH REFEREE

The mark awarded by a club must be based on the referee's overall performance, It is most important that the mark is awarded fairly and not based upon isolated incidents or previous games. The referee's performance should be determined by the table below which should act as a guide for the overall mark which should fall within the mark range for each standard of performance.

Mark – Range	Comment
91-100	The referee was extremely accurate in decision making and very successfully controlled the game using management and communication skills to create an environment of fair play, adding real value to the game.
81-90	The referee was very accurate in decision making and successfully controlled the game using management and communication skills to create an environment of fair play.
71 - 80	The referee was accurate in decision making and controlled the game well, communicating with the players, making a positive contribution towards fair play.
61-70	The referee was reasonably accurate in decision making, controlled the game quite well and communicated with players, establishing a reasonable degree of fair play.
51-60	The referee had some shortcomings in the level of accuracy of decision making and control, with only limited success in communicating with the players resulting in variable fair play.
50 and below	The referee had significant shortcomings in the level of accuracy of decision making and control with poor communication with the players which resulted in low levels of fair play

Notes

- ◆ Using a scale of up to 100 allows greater flexibility for clubs to distinguish between different refereeing performances more accurately.
- ◆ A mark within each mark range can be given to reflect the referee's performance e.g. a mark of 79 indicates a somewhat better performance than a mark of 71.
- ◆ A mark between 71 and 80 represents the standard of refereeing expected.
- ◆ When a mark of 50 or less is awarded, an explanation must be provided to the League or Competition by completing the appropriate box on the marking form. It must include comments which could help improve the referee's future performances. Even where a referee has significant shortcomings there will have been some positive aspects which should be given credit; extremely low marks (below 20) should be very rare.

How to decide on the Referee's Mark

The following questions focus on the key areas of a referee's performance. They are intended as an "aide memoire", are not necessarily comprehensive and need not be answered individually. It is, however, worth considering them before committing yourself to a mark for the referee.

CONTROL AND DECISION MAKING

- ◆ How well did the referee control the game?
- ◆ Were the players' actions recognized correctly?
- ◆ Were the Laws applied correctly?
- ◆ Were all incidents dealt with efficiently/effectively?
- ◆ Were all the appropriate sanctions applied correctly?
- ◆ Was the referee always within reasonable distance of incidents?
- ◆ Was the referee well positioned to make critical decisions, especially in and around the penalty area?
- ◆ Did the referee understand the players' positional intentions and keep out of the way accordingly?
- ◆ Did the referee demonstrate alertness and concentration throughout the game?
- ◆ Did the referee apply the use of the advantage to suit the mood and temperature of the game?
- ◆ Was the referee aware of the players' attitude to advantage?
- ◆ Did the referee use the assistants effectively?
- ◆ Did the officials work as a team, and did the referee lead and manage them to the benefit of the game?

COMMUNICATION AND PLAYER MANAGEMENT

- ◆ How well did the referee communicate with the players during the game?
- ◆ Did the referee's level of involvement/profile suit this particular game?
- ◆ Did the referee understand the players' problems on the day – e.g. difficult ground/weather conditions?
- ◆ Did the referee respond to the changing pattern of play/mood of players?
- ◆ Did the referee demonstrate empathy for the game, allowing it to develop in accordance with the tempo of the game?
- ◆ Was the referee pro-active in controlling of the game?
- ◆ Was the referee's authority asserted firmly without being officious?
- ◆ Was the referee confident and quick thinking?
- ◆ Did the referee appear unflustered and unhurried when making critical decisions?
- ◆ Did the referee permit undue questioning of decisions?
- ◆ Did the referee deal effectively with players crowding around after decisions/incidents?
- ◆ Was effective player management in evidence?
- ◆ Was the referee's body language confident and open at all times?
- ◆ Did the pace of the game, the crowd or player pressure affect the referee negatively?

Final Thoughts

- ◆ Always try to be objective when marking. You may not obtain the most objective view by marking immediately after the game.
- ◆ Judge the performance over the whole game. Don't be too influenced by one particular incident.
- ◆ Don't mark the referee down unfairly because your team was unlucky and lost the game or some disciplinary action was taken against your players.

LEAGUE RULES – 2020 - 2021 SEASON

CHILD PROTECTION

1. Any act, statement, conduct or other matter which harms a child or children, or poses or may pose a risk of harm to a child or children, shall constitute behaviour which is improper and brings the game into disrepute.
2. In these Regulations the expression "Offence" shall mean any one or more of the offences contained in Schedule 1 to the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 and any other criminal offence which reasonably causes The Association to believe that the person accused of the offence poses or may pose a risk of harm to a child or children.
3. Upon receipt by The Association of:
 - 3.1 notification that an individual has been charged with an Offence; or
 - 3.2 notification that an individual is the subject of an investigation by the Police, Social Services or any other authority relating to an Offence; or
 - 3.3 any other information which causes The Association reasonably to believe that a person poses or may pose a risk of harm to a child or children then The Association shall have the power to order that the individual be suspended from all or any specific football activity for such period and on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit.
4. In reaching its determination as to whether an order under Regulation 3 should be made The Association shall give consideration, inter alia, to the following factors:
 - 4.1 whether a child is or children are or may be at risk of harm;
 - 4.2 whether the matters are of a serious nature;
 - 4.3 whether an order is necessary or desirable to allow the conduct of any investigation by The Association or any other authority or body to proceed unimpeded.
5. The period of an order referred to in 3 above shall not be capable of lasting beyond the date upon which any charge under The Rules of The Association or any Offence is decided or brought to an end.
6. Where an order is imposed on an individual under Regulation 3 above, The Association shall bring and conclude any proceedings under the Rules of The Association against the person relating to the matters as soon as reasonably practicable.
7. Where a person is convicted, or is made the subject of a caution in respect of an Offence, that shall constitute a breach of the Rules of The Association and The Association shall have the power to order the suspension of the person from all or any specific football activity for such a period (including indefinitely) and on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit.
8. For the purposes of these Regulations, The Association shall act through its Council or any Committee or Sub-Committee thereof, including the Board.
9. Notification in writing of an order referred to above shall be given to the person concerned and/or any Club with which he is associated as soon as reasonably practicable.
10. The applicable standard of proof shall be the civil standard, of the balance of probability. The more serious the allegation taking into account the nature of the misconduct alleged and the context of the case the greater the burden of evidence required to find the matter proved. Save that for charges pursuant to The Football Association's Child Protection Policy, where the welfare and protection of children shall be paramount and the test shall be whether more likely than not.

GROUND GRADING REQUIREMENTS

Regional NLS Feeder Leagues Minimum Ground Grading Guidelines

1. GROUND

1.1 Security of Tenure

Where a club does not own the freehold of their ground then evidence of adequate security of tenure must be provided.

1.2 Ground Share

Ground sharing would be at the discretion of each league within the National League System, taking into account local circumstances. Where ground sharing is permitted the club must have sole control over and use of facilities on match days.

Ground sharing must not be allowed in order for a club to gain promotion.

1.3 Capacity

There is no stated ground capacity.

1.4 Boundary of Ground

There is no requirement for a ground to be enclosed in any way.

1.5 Clubhouse

A clubhouse facility, whilst being desirable, is not compulsory.

If a clubhouse facility exists either on or adjacent to the ground, this should be open on match days to provide refreshments to spectators.

1.6 Car Parking

There should be adequate car parking facilities on or adjacent to the ground.

1.7 Pitch Perimeter Barrier

As a minimum, there must be post and rope surrounding the pitch on all those sides that may be occupied by spectators.

The barrier, if other than solid wall type of construction may be infilled. Advertising boards may be acceptable as a means of infill.

Ideally, there should be a minimum of 1.83 metres, ideally 2 metres between the touchline, goal line and the pitch perimeter barrier.

1.8 Pitch Standards

The playing surface will be grass, unless otherwise authorised by the respective League Rules and must be of an acceptable standard. It must be free from surface depressions and excessive undulations.

The maximum slope allowable shall not exceed an even gradient of vertical to horizontal 1 : 41 in any direction.

1.9 Playing Area

The playing area is to be in accordance with the requirements of the Laws of the Game. Law 1 states that the length of the touchline must be greater than the length of the goal line.

Length	-	Minimum 90 m (100 yds)	Maximum 120 m (130 yds)
Width	-	Minimum 45 m (50 yds)	Maximum 90 m (100 yds)

It should be noted that at Grade H the playing area must be a minimum of 100 metres x 64 metres.

Goal posts and goal net supports should be of professional manufacture and conform to the current safety requirements and to the requirements of the Laws of the Game.

Reference should be made to the Goalpost Safety Information booklet published by The Football Association.

1.10 Technical Area

Portable trainers' boxes are permitted and must be securely fixed when in use.

It is desirable for a Technical Area to be marked out in accordance with the guidance contained in the 'Laws of the Game' booklet.

1.11 Secure Walkway

A secure walkway is not a requirement.

1.12 Floodlighting

Floodlighting is not compulsory at this Grade.

However, where it is provided it must be to an average lux reading of 120. No single reading can be less than one quarter of the highest reading so as to ensure an even spread of light.

Reading shall be on a grid of 88 markings (8 across, 11 down) evenly spaced with the outside readings falling on the pitch boundary line. The average of all the readings is taken to be the average illumination level in lux of the floodlighting installation.

The lux values must be tested every two years in accordance with current guidelines by an approved independent contractor.

When new or improved installations are being planned, an average lux. reading of 180 should be provided.

1.13 Public Address System

A public address system is not compulsory.

1.14 Entrances

There is no requirement for fixed entry points.

However, where a turnstile is installed, it must be fully operational and of the controlled revolving type.

1.15 Exits

Where fixed exit points are provided, there must be sufficient to ensure the safe evacuation of the ground if necessary.

All exits must be clearly signposted.

1.16 Emergency Access

Access for emergency services should be provided.

2. SPECTATOR FACILITIES

2.1 Seated Accommodation

Seated accommodation is not a requirement.

2.2 Covered Standing Accommodation

Covered accommodation is not compulsory.

Hard standing is not compulsory.

However, where it is provided it must be a minimum width of 0.9 metre, measured from the spectator side of the pitch perimeter barrier where provided. .

2.3 Toilets

Provision should be made for adequate toilet facilities.

2.4 Refreshment Facilities

Refreshment facilities for spectators are not compulsory.

3. DRESSING ROOM FACILITIES

All dressing rooms must be secure and suitable for purpose

3.1 Players

Separate dressing rooms must be provided for both teams. Existing dressing room dimensions will be in order, provided that they are of a minimum of 12 square metres, excluding shower and toilet areas. However, clubs wishing to progress should be aware of the need to increase to a minimum of 18 square metres. Where clubs are planning to build new changing rooms, these must be planned to be a minimum size of 18 square metres, excluding shower and toilet areas.

Each dressing room should have the following:

A shower area comprising of at least 3 working showerheads for each team – if not located in the dressing room then they must be located adjacent to it.

Adequate toilet facilities exclusively for the use of players - if not located in the dressing room then they must be located adjacent to it and must not be accessible to the general public.

Hot and cold running water

Shared shower facilities are not acceptable.

Ideally separate toilet facilities should be provided for each team. It is not acceptable for players and match officials to share toilet facilities.

In order to be considered for promotion to Step 6, clubs must have en suite shower and toilet facilities with a minimum of 4 showerheads.

3.2 Match Officials

Separate dressing rooms must be provided for match officials, the minimum size of which shall be 4 square metres excluding shower and toilet areas.

Each match official's dressing room should have the following:

At least 1 working showerhead.

Adequate toilet facilities, exclusively for the use of match officials, which must be separate from those provided for the players. These do not necessarily need to be situated in the dressing room but must not be accessible to the general public.

Hot and cold running water

Provision should be made for changing accommodation for both male and female match officials.

When new changing rooms are being planned or existing changing rooms refurbished an area of 6 square metres and facilities for mixed gender match officials should be provided.

In order to comply with the G Grade after promotion to Step 6, clubs must provide en suite shower and toilet facilities for the match officials.

All dressing room areas to be maintained to a high level of cleanliness and secure on match days.

4. MEDICAL

There must be a suitable qualified person (minimum F.A. Save a Life) in attendance.

All clubs must provide first aid equipment at their ground.

APPENDIX A

Minimum conditions for acceptance to play in the Premier Division in conjunction with the prevailing FA National League System Step 7 ground grading requirements.

1 – Pitch

- (a) The playing area shall be fully enclosed by a barrier, either of a permanent railing or removable ropes, positioned not less than 2 metres from the goal line / touch line and be a minimum height of 1 metre. All substitutes, Club Officials and spectators shall remain outside the barrier.
- (b) Where complying with (a) is impractical, the Management Committee or member(s) authorised by the Management Committee shall grant permission prior to the fixture being played.
- (c) All other requirements shall be as per The Football Association Publication Laws of Association Football and Guide for Players and Referees.

2 – Hospitality

- (a) The Home Club is responsible for providing drinks for both competing Teams and Match Officials at either half time or full time. Drinks are to be either hot or cold depending on weather conditions.
- (b) After the match a room or area not necessarily at the same venue as the pitch, (but where possible within one mile of the pitch), shall be made available for players, Club Officials and Match Officials where food is provided free of charge to the opposing Team and Match Officials. No Longer mandatory.

Where the venue is not at the same venue as the pitch, the opposing Team and Match Officials shall be supplied with sandwiches in their dressing rooms. (Food is no longer Mandatory)

3 – Assistant Referees

- (a) Assistant Referees, where possible shall be appointed for the Senior Division. In all matches where no appointment is made it is the responsibility of each Club to provide a Club Assistant Referee for the match.
- (b) The Club Assistant Referee shall not be a nominated substitute for the match.
- (c) Where possible the Club Assistant Referee shall be a qualified Referee.

4 - Technical Areas

Where a technical area is provided in accordance with the Laws of the Game, a maximum of five (5) substitutes and two (2) officials shall occupy the designated seated area. The officials and substitutes' names to be given to the Referee before the game.

5 - First Aiders

At the start of each season all Premier Division Clubs shall supply to the General Secretary the name, together with the certificate number and pass date, of a person who has undertaken and has a valid FA Save a Life Certificate.

Each Club shall have a suitable qualified person (minimum FA Save a Life) in attendance at all Premier Division and Senior Division Cup matches.

All Clubs shall provide first aid equipment at their ground including a stretcher.

TOP GOAL SCORER AWARD

Rules

1. Only goals scored in Thames Valley Premier League, league matches are eligible for consideration (note goals scored in any cup competition are ineligible).
2. Top scorers are nominated for each division of the League. Only goals scored when playing for a team in that division will be considered. Goals scored when a player takes part in a match in another division, cannot be added together.
3. If a player transfers to another club within the same division during the season, goals scored for his previous club (s) will be carried over to his new club. In all other transfers, goals scored for previous club (s) will not be eligible to be carried over to his new club.
4. A list of goal scorers appears on the League's FA Full Time website. Club Secretaries that do not agree with the figures should lodge an appeal with the League General Secretary.
5. The League Officers will be the final arbitrator of the number of goals scored by an individual player. Their decision is final.
6. The closing date for appeals regarding possible inaccuracies with the number of goals credited to individual players will be 15th May in any season. No appeals will be accepted after this date.
7. Appeals will only be accepted from Club Secretaries, (ie not players or team managers).
