OUR HISTORY



Early history suggests that the village football club was formed in 1904, after a meeting at the local village hall. They initially played friendly matches before deciding that they affiliate to the Surrey County Football Association in 1907. They began life in the junior leagues before gradually progressing through the leagues. The most recent history shows the Lea playing in the Aldershot leagues and progressing through the various divisions, eventually obtaining promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League Western in 1978.

Progress through the three divisions saw the Lea eventually promoted to the Surrey Premier League in 1986. This was for one year only as we obtained the dubious distinction of being relegated with the highest points total ever achieved by a side being relegated.

Season 1988 saw us again in the Surrey Intermediate League Western. The ensuing years saw the ups and downs that one experiences until season 2002/03 which saw eventual promotion to Senior Football via The Hellenic League. This was not without its problems as The FA at Soho Square tried to block the move. It was only the determination of the committee and the full backing of The Hellenic League that eventually saw us given the green light along with London APSA (Essex Senior League) and Sporting Bengal (Kent League).

In our first season we took time to adjust to Senior Football eventually finishing 4th from bottom under the guidance of manager Maurice Gregory.

Season 2004/05, David Ford took over the management reigns with Nathan Fealey and in their first season took the side to a credible 7th place finish. Season 2005/06 saw the 1st team finish mid table and reach two cup finals. They narrowly lost out to Sandhurst Town in the Aldershot Senior Cup on penalties but beat Penn & Tylers Green in the Hellenic Supplementary Cup.

2006/07 saw them yet again lose out on penalties in the Aldershot Senior Cup this time against Camberley Town. On the league front they produced some fantastic football all season and after chasing Bisley Sports for most of the season ended up finishing in 3rd place.

The 3rd place finish was enough to enable us to take up a promotion position and with a groundshare secured with near neighbours Farnborough we were able to do so.

2007/08 season under the guidance of Dave Ford we finished our first season at Step 5 in a respectable 11th place and beaten finalists in the Aldershot Senior Cup losing by the odd goal against Fleet Town. The National League's Committee then sanctioned a move to the Combined Counties Premier League for season 2008/09 where they swapped places with Reading Town. Season 2009/10 saw us reach the 2nd qualifying round of the FA Cup as well as reaching the 3rd round proper of the FA


Vase. We also reached the Semi Final of the Surrey Senior Cup beating Woking on the way. Eventually losing to Sutton Utd. Season 2010/11 saw us finish 6th in the league and finally win the Aldershot Senior Cup defeating Fleet Town on penalties. Season 2011/12 saw us finish in a disappointing league position, the lowest at Step 5. We still managed to get to a Cup Final at Aldershot Town, where we lost out to Ashford Town (Middx) in The Aldershot Senior Cup Final. Season 2012/13 saw Mark Anderson replace Dave Ford as manager and he finished in an excellent 7th place and also led the team to the FA Cup 3rd Qualifying round where after beating Ryman League sides Folkestone Invicta and Premier side Leiston, finally lost out to Southern Premier side Chippenham Town. Mark Anderson resigned for personal reasons in July 2013 and the club appointed Ryan Scott and Nick Sowden as joint managers. In November 2013 Trevor Norris was appointed and he steered us to a safe position at the end of the 2013/14 season. In September 2014 Trevor Norris resigned his position as manager and was replaced by Mark Thomas. He was joined by James Reeves and Coach Darren Barnard. An excellent run of results left us finishing in a very credible 8th position. In September 2015, ex-Hartley Wintney manager, Ben Dillon replaced Mark Thomas and with him comes Jason Minton and Steve Saunders as part of his management team.

In July 2016, ex-Reading player Neville Roach took over the management role and bought with him Matty Angell and the experienced Mick Wollen. In October 2016, Neville resigned his position and joined Basingstoke Town as their new U21 manager. The club appointed new Manager Michael Charles, who along with his assistant/coach Darryl Jelly and Luke Wheeler. Sadly, we lost our Step 5 status at the end of the season and found ourselves in Step 6. For season 2017/18 we started a groundshare arrangement at Camberley Town whilst our new ground is under construction. In October 2017, Michael Charles resigned and we turned to ex-manager Mark Thomas who successfully led us to immediate promotion back to the Premier Division at the end of the 2017/18 season. Sadly, Mark had to resign his duties and after an extensive search and interview process, we appointed the successful Keith Hills, from fellow Premier Division team, Knaphill to lead us back into the Premier Division for season 2018/19. In December 2018 we appointed a management team of Gav Smith/Dave Ford as Joint Manager's along with Paul Harkness as coach and Dan Bailey as assistant. They galvanised the squad and finished in an excellent 9th place.

In 1997 the first Youth Team joined the Club and this saw the beginning of the very successful Youth and Colts section of the Club. We increased from one team to over 20 and were given extra facility to accommodate this success.

Gav Smith (Joint Manager) – Joined the club in December 2018. Gav had a successful playing career for Fleet Town, Ashford Town (Middx) , Bracknell Town, Godalming Town as well as previously playing for us under Michael Charles's. He went into management at Godalming Town but resigned at the end of last season and took up an assistant manager's role at Bracknell Town under Carl Davies, Carl stepped down in October to concentrate on playing and Gav disappointingly left the club.

Dave Ford (Joint Manager) – Joined the club in December 2018. Dave is a very well known character within the football club and arguably has been one of the longest serving managers we have had. His tenure lasted nine years and in that time he built some really good sides and he put the club firmly on the map. His enthusiasm and experience will be invaluable to the players and fellow management team

Paul Harkness (Coach) – Joined the club in December 2018. Again Paul is well known to the club, in fact he has previously been joint caretaker manager with Mark Anderson. More recently he has built up a successful coaching company called Pulse and he will running a new one out of our new ground from September. Paul's playing career was dominated by his time at local side Farnborough Town, where he is seen as somewhat of a legend. He also had a successful time at Camberley Town. Again Paul's experience and knowledge will be invaluable to his fellow management team as well as the players.

Dan Bailey (Assistant Manager/Coach) – Joined the club in January 2019. Dan is well known to the club and previously played under Dave Ford in the Hellenic League days. His first steps into management and coaching has seen him at Fleet Town U18's with Neil Selby where they have run a successful team.

Megan Tubridy (Sports Injury Therapist) – Joined the club in July 2019. Megan has graduated from Chichester University and has now moved back into the area. She has practical experience from her time at Wessex League side Hythe & Dibden. Will prove to be a valuable member of the matchday squad

Kallum Lunn (Goalkeeper) – Joined the club in July 2019. Kallum has previously played for Camberley Town and progressed through their youth ranks. He returned to the UK having starred for New Zealand side North Shore Utd and helped them secure promotion.

Nojus Trinovas (Goalkeeper) – Joined the club in pre season July 2019. An excellent prospect. Will be dual registered with Slough Town

Josh Pound (Defender) - Rejoined the club in July 2018. Previously with Godalming Town and Camberley Town where he has gained valuable experience. Can play in defence or midfield and again his versatility will be invaluable.

Scott Armsworth (Defender) – Joined the club in August 2019. Scott came to us in pre-season and impressed in games v Aldershot Town and Woking. National League South side Slough Town signed him in July 2019 and he joins us on a dual registration basis. Strong and quick defender who has a bright future.

Darren Blake (Defender/Midfield)- A Baggies Legend, 19 years at the club. 'Blakey' represented the Hellenic League and won Golden Boot in their Premier Division. The former Millwall youth player can play anywhere, and is as capable preventing opposition goals as scoring for Badshot Lea. A versatile player who will play anywhere for the cause.

Ben Hutchings (Defender) – Rejoined the club in July 2019. Previously with Camberley Town. Excellent defender and is also another player who is comfortable on the ball

Liam Roberts (Defender) Rejoined the club in July 2018 after spending the last few seasons at Camberley Town. Previously with Godalming Town in the Ryman league. An excellent left footed defender and very comfortable on the ball.

Liam Flanagan (Defender) Joined the club in July 2018. Previously with Fleet Town. Will add balance to the backline. Excellent header of the ball.

Drew Matthews (Midfield) Joined the club in July 2019. Drew has Combined Counties experience having previously played for Frimley Green. Returned to the UK last season having had a successful spell in New Zealand for Napier City Rovers. Been impressive in pre season.

Ashley Lloyd (Midfield) Joined the club in July 2018 from Southern League side Fleet Town where he was an ever present last season. Previously with Godalming Town in their Ryman League campaign. A natural leader and his experience will be important this season.

Mac Ford (Midfield) Rejoined the club in October 2018. He spent last season at Camberley Town before going to New Zealand, where he helped North Shore to promotion. Delighted to have him back and he will drive the team on in the centre of midfield.

OUR CHARITY

We are delighted that Badshot Lea Football Club have chosen the Cystic Fibrosis Trust as one of their chosen charities.

Our son Freddie is 8 years old and has played for the club since he was 5; starting off at Little Strikers on a Saturday morning and then joining the Gladiators as an U7. When Freddie was 4 weeks old he was diagnosed with cystic fibrosis which is one of the UK's most common genetic conditions affecting just over 10,000 people.

CF mainly affects the respiratory and digestive systems but can impact on other organs in the body too, including the liver. It is a life-limiting condition and the twice daily routine of medication, physio and treatments cannot be escaped as they are essential to ensure a long and healthy life. There is currently no cure.

Raising awareness and fundraising for the Cystic Fibrosis Trust is so important to us. Freddie has benefitted first hand from the work of the charity through the trial of new medicines, advances in physiotherapy and developments in research and guidance not to mention the amazing moral support that we receive from everyone we come into contact with. HAYES & YEADING UNITED



Hayes & Yeading United Football Club was created in May 2007 when the two clubs respective Chairmen, Derek Goodall and Philip Spurden agreed that the only way either club could continue, long term, at the level they were playing would be to join forces as a single entity.

Hayes FC was founded in 1909, as Botwell Misson, when Eileen Shackle, the teenage daughter of a wealthy land agent, encouraged the local youngsters to form a football team. The team was originally known as Botwell Mission, after the mission church that was built in memory of her grandfather, and that still stands today as part of the Hayes Library in Golden Crescent. Yeading FC was also founded with youth in mind beginning their existence in 1960 as Yeading Youth Club, started by brothers Ray and Carl Gritt.

By the time the two clubs were both in existence, Botwell Mission had changed its name to Hayes FC in June 1929 where having progressed through the Great Western Suburban League and the Spartan League they were then accepted into the Athenian League. In their first season at this level they reached the final of the FA Amateur Cup. This was notable for the fact that the club had started at the 1st qualifying round stage, and had played all its nine matches away from home, travelling an estimated 1,500 miles to places as diverse as Wisbech, Trowbridge, Stalybridge (where Northern Nomads played), and York for a semi-final against Bishop Auckland. The final was lost to Wycombe Wanderers by one goal to nil. The Athenian League was won for the only time in season 1956-57 on goal average over Finchley and the semi-final of the Amateur Cup was reached, losing to Bishop Auckland before a crowd of 32,000 at St James Park, Newcastle.

While the sixties were pretty lean for Hayes FC, the newly formed Yeading FC were starting to get noticed at a junior level, having moved to Warren Park in 1965. As Uxbridge League Premier Division Runners up in 1967 Yeading moved into the newly formed West Middlesex Combination Premier Division and having notched a league and couple double that same season joined the South West Middlesex League. That first season (1968/69) Yeading won the West Drayton Charity Cup, and more prestigiously the Middlesex Junior Cup for the first time while also securing the Division One Title. Further promotion led to back-to-back South West Middlesex Premier Division titles and in 1970/71 Yeading also won both the Middlesex Junior and Intermediate Cups. During the 1970s they won the latter five times and the former twice.

In 1971/72 Hayes FC were elected to the Isthmian League while Yeading FC earned promotion to the Middlesex League seeing Championship success in their first season (1971/72), scoring a record 122 goals in the process. Season 1972/73 saw Yeading sweep all four trophies - League and Cup - in the Middlesex League while over at Church Road Hayes FC hit the headlines with an FA Cup first round defeat of Football League side Bristol Rovers before taking

Reading to a second round replay.

The eighties saw Hayes FC maintain their Isthmian League status year on year without much danger of movement up or down while Yeading FC had started their climb upwards at no mean rate of knots. The Ding moved from the Middlesex League to the Spartan League going unbeaten through 1986/87 and earning promotion to the Isthmian League Division Two South in the process. The turn of the decade saw Yeading hit the national headlines when they became the first Middlesex side to lift the FA Vase, having drawn at Wembley, they travelled to Leeds' Elland Road where they secured a 1-0 victory over Bridlington Town.

Season 1992/93 saw Yeading's meteoric rise through the leagues reach the Isthmian Premier, the first time neighbours Hayes FC and Yeading FC were to become rivals. This rivalry was to last until 1996 when Hayes FC reached the pinnacle of non-league football by winning the Isthmian League championship by one goal in a nail-biting finale which also involved Enfield, Yeovil Town and Boreham Wood. The club maintained a presence at this level for six seasons, including finishing in 3rd place in 1998-9, before suffering relegation for the first time in 2002 at which time Yeading FC had dropped out of the Isthmian Premier so the renewal of rivalry would have to wait.

Hayes FC were to become one of the founder members of the Conference South League and were soon joined by neighbours Yeading FC, renewing the rivalry for a couple of seasons before the biggest sporting news the area had seen for many years.....

Hayes and Yeading United FC – Merged rivals.

After a season of consolidation, the newly merged side took many people by surprise in 2008/09 when a late season Conference South record equalling run of 10 consecutive victories saw a play-off place earned. Looking dead and buried at 4-0 down after 50 minutes of the semi-final first leg, only a dreamer would have predicted a place in the final. Dreams do come true though and two late first leg goals and a 4-0 extra time victory in the second leg at Eastleigh saw the final reached. A tight final ensued but Hampton & Richmond Borough were seen off by the odd goal in five and promotion was achieved to the pinnacle of non-league football, the Blue Square Premier. United more than held their own in the top flight for the first two seasons but with a much reduced budget and 5 years of ground sharing due to the late completion of the Club's new stadium, United hit the relegation trap-door in April 2012 and again in April 2016 and April 2017 before beginning its life in a new Stadium in 2017/18, losing the promotion play-off semi-final to Cambridge City at season end before a switch to the Bostik League for 2018/19 saw United romp to the title and promotion with a 16 point advantage at season end.

PAUL HUGHES – Manager

Paul began his career with his local side, Chelsea, and started well, scoring on his debut against Derby County with an impressive solo effort. Thereafter, however, his career was stalled by injuries, successive managers' squad rotation policies and the signing of other midfielders like Roberto Di Matteo, Gustavo Poyet and Didier Deschamps. Chelsea won the 1996–97 FA Cup; Paul was left out of the squad for the final but played in the quarter-final against Portsmouth. The following year Chelsea won the European Cup Winners Cup (1997–98) and although he played in the earlier rounds of the competition he did not make the squad for the final in Stockholm. Over the next three years he only featured in 24 more games for the club, and had loan spells with Stockport, Crewe and Norwich, scoring against Swindon Town. Paul joined Southampton, then managed by his old Chelsea manager Glenn Hoddle, on a free transfer in the summer of 2000, but due to a lengthy groin injury and subsequent change of manager, left a year later having never played a game for the Saints.

His next club was Luton Town, where he remained until May 2006, making 88 appearances and scoring seven goals for the club helping them gain promotion from League 2 and become champions of League 1. In 2012, he was appointed joint manager at Kings Langley alongside Ritchie Hanlon. The pair led Kings Langley to back to back promotions, finishing 2nd in Spartan South Midlands Division One in 2014, and then winning the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division title in 2015. Following a third consecutive promotion that saw Kings Langley FC become champions of the Southern Central Division and took the club to the Southern Premier Division and then Paul, alongside Hanlon, moved to Hayes & Yeading United in November 2016. Having been unable to stave off relegation in his first season and with Ritchie departing soon after due to personal reasons, Paul took sole control of the side and led United to the play-offs in 2017/18 where defeat to Cambridge City denied United promotion. Having switched to the newly created Bostik South Central division last season Paul assembled a squad that took the division by storm hitting 129 goals and going up as Champions with sixteen point cushion as the curtain came down on proceedings.

JACK SMITH – Goalkeeper

26 year-old goalkeeper who joined Hayes & Yeading during the summer of 2017 having impressed against United the previous season for Dunstable Town. Jack started out in the youth set up at Watford before moving to Swindon Town and then Hemel Hempstead Town, making his first team debut while still playing for the Tudors at under-18 level. While with the Tudors he made a handful of appearances for Dunstable Town and after leaving Hemel he signed for London Colney. This was followed by spells with Ware, Berkhamsted and London Colney again before settling at Dunstable Town last season where he made the number 1 shirt his own. Made 27 appearances last season for United before being struck down by injury in the second half of the season, returned fully fit and in fine

form in September 2018. By season end Jack had equalled coach Delroy Preddie's record number of clean sheets in a season and now returns for a third campaign in which he has already equalled Delroy's overall club clean sheet record.

MARK CHILDS – Goalkeeper

22 year-old goalkeeper who joined Hayes & Yeading in September 2019 on a short term loan from National League South side Weymouth whom he had joined in February 2019. Due to injury, Mark had to wait until May 2019 to make his Weymouth debut however he was to be the hero in the Southern League Champions of Champions fixture at Kettering Town when he saved a penalty in normal time and two in the penalty shootout to help Weymouth to the Southern League title. Has also played for Gosport Borough and Eastleigh.

LIAM MCDEVITT - Defender

Experienced defender who joined Hayes & Yeading in the summer of 2018 having spent the previous campaign in the Southern Premier with St Neots Town. Started out with Stevenage before moving to Hitchin Town and then Royston Town. After a handful of appearances for each he settled at Barton Rovers for several seasons, interspersed with a brief return to Royston. In the summer of 2016 Liam moved to St Ives Town where he spent a full season and faced United in the Southern League Cup final, being one of the home sides scorers in United's penalty shoot-out victory. From St Ives he switched to St Neots at the start of last season and now comes to United where he has been a rock at the heart of the United defence all season long. After a stand out season in United's defence, Liam opted to sign for Biggleswade Town during the summer of 2019 only to return to United before the end of August 2019

TAOIFIQ OLOMOWEWE - Defender

Former product of the Hayes & Yeading youth system who always looked destined to push ahead in his career and this was shown when having moved into the Nike Academy he was snapped up by then Championship side Burnley who after a handful of development games offered him a professional contract. After his release by Burnley, he moved back south and returned to the non-league scene with our neighbours Wealdstone. From the Stones he had loan spells with Maldon & Tiptree and Enfield Town, signing for the latter permanently before moving Hendon and then to Carshalton Athletic last season. Signed for Hayes & Yeading in July 2019.

DEAN MASON - Defender

30 year-old defender and current Montserrat International who joined Hayes & Yeading in the summer of 2019 from National League side Maidenhead United. Dean started his career in the Southampton Academy before moving to the Barnet youth side and into their first team squad. After 2 years with the Bees he moved to AFC Wimbledon where he helped them to the Conference South title. From the Dons he had short spells with Maidenhead, Bishop's Stortford, Maidenhead and Haringey before settling in at Canvey Island in 2012. The following season he moved to Wingate & Finchley then Arlesey before spending a couple of years with Lowestoft Town. From there he has been with Concord, Cambridge City, Ware and Enfield Town prior to joining the Magpies last season.

ISMAIL YAKUBU - Defender

Vastly experienced central defender who arrived at Hayes & Yeading in the summer of 2019 from Isthmian Premier side Kingstonian. Born in Kano, Nigeria, Ismail came through the youth ranks at Barnet making just shy of 300 appearances for the Bees in his 9 seasons with them during which time he was capped by England C five times. From Barnet he spent a season with AFC Wimbledon before being signed by Newport County where he again exceeded the 100 appearance mark in a spell that included a Wembley FA Trophy final appearance against York City. From Newport he moved to Woking where he captained the side and then in June 2017 he signed for Hemel Hempstead Town prior to joining Kingstonian in February 2019.

KEVIN SONGOLO - Defender

Tall defender who joined Hayes & Yeading in the summer of 2019 from Essex Senior League side Tower Hamlets after showing well during pre-season. Kevin came through the academy system at Fleetwood Town before missing some playing time through injury.

JACK WILLIAMS - Defender

21 year-old left-back who joined Hayes & Yeading in August 2019 having come through the youth system at Queens Park Rangers for whom he first played at age 9 before leaving the R's in January 2019. While at QPR he had a short loan spell in the National League South with Bishop's Stortford from March 2017 and this was followed by a loan spell with Wycombe Wanderers the next season where he made his professional debut in a Football League Cup tie against Fulham before making his league debut shortly after against Notts County.

MATT HALL - Defender

22 year-old central defender who re-joined Hayes & Yeading in the summer of 2019 having originally joined at the end of August 2017 on dual registration from National League South side Hemel Hempstead Town. Matt started out in the youth academy at Vicarage Road before moving north of the border to play for Ross County. After leaving United first time around Matt has spent time with Northwood, Chesham United and Barton Rovers.

MITCHAL GOUGH - Defender

24 year-old central defender who joined Hayes & Yeading United in March 2019 from Southern Premier side Harrow Borough. Mitchal

started out with Ashford Town (Middlesex) before moving to Staines Town in August 2015. Subsequent moves took him to both Merstham, Kingstonian and back to Merstham at the start of the current season, joining Harrow Borough from the latter a few weeks later. Impressive in his short time with the club and now returns for a full campaign in the Southern Premier South.

KEANO ROBINSON - Defender

21 year-old versatile defender who re-joined Hayes & Yeading United in the summer of 2019 having first signed in September 2017. Pacey defender who came through the youth ranks at Peterborough United and spent some time with Sutton Common Rovers in the Combined Counties League. Showed some impressive form during the 2017/18 campaign and was re-signed by Paul Hughes for last season's campaign however limited starting opportunities led to him cutting short his tenure by signing for Cambridge City in November 2018.

JEROME ECCLESTON - Defender

Defender who joined Hayes & Yeading on the eve of the new season having spent the past two years with Beaconsfield Town. Started out with Southall before a season with AFC Hayes was followed by spells with Egham Town and Chesham United before arriving with Beaconsfield in 2017.

TOBY LITTLE – Defender / Midfield

30 year-old left sided defender or midfield player who returned to Hayes & Yeading United from Bostik Premier side Kingstonian in October 2017. Originally came through the youth ranks at Hayes FC before signing for United at the start of the merged Clubs first season, 2007/08 after a single game for the now defunct Team Bath. Appearances were limited by a series of injuries in his first two seasons but he fought these off to play a regular part in the clubs inaugural Conference Premier campaign before departing to join Woking in July 2010. From Woking he joined Uxbridge and then Staines before finding a settled home at Basingstoke Town for a couple of seasons. From the Dragons he moved to Chesham United where he played for five seasons before leaving for Kingstonian in the summer of 2017. Made his 150th United appearance in the penultimate game of United's championship winning campaign last season scoring an amazing 23 goals from his wing-back position and this campaign has seen him surpass the club goalscoring record previously held by striker Josh Scott.

CONNOR TOOMEY – Defender / Midfield

24 year-old defender or midfield player who returned to Hayes & Yeading in March 2019 from Berkhamsted having originally signed for United in November 2016 from then fellow Southern Premier side Kings Langley for whom he had made in excess of 125 appearances. Started out in the Kings youth ranks before moving to Berkhamsted, playing a handful of first team games for them in 2011/12 before returning to Kings Langley the following season.

Started 21 games for United in 2016/17 but departed before the end of the season to take a break from the game. Returned to playing at the start of the current campaign with Chesham United before switching to one of his former sides, Berkhamsted, in October 2018.

JACOB COOK – Midfield

20 year-old central midfielder who joined Hayes & Yeading on the eve of the campaign on a short term loan from National League South side Wealdstone having arrived with the Stones during the summer from Kings Langley. Jacob started out in the youth system at Watford and was in the Hornet's Under-18 title-winning side before leaving in 2016.

DYLAN SWITTERS – Midfield

18 year-old midfielder who joined United in the summer from Stevenage after showing well during pre-season. Dylan began his career at Norwich City where he played regularly for the Canaries at under 18 level before signing an 18 month scholarship with Stevenage in December 2017. Made his professional debut for Stevenage in April 2018 against Exeter City as a 90th minute substitute. Had loan spells last season with Great Yarmouth, scoring 3 times in just five appearances before another loan spell saw him spend time with Kings Langley.

SCOTT DONNELLY - Midfield

Vastly experienced ball playing central midfielder who joined Hayes and Yeading in late October 2017 from National League South side Chippenham Town whom he had joined during the summer. Started out with QPR, making his debut against Preston aged just 16 in October 2004. Went on to make more than a dozen appearances for the R's before being released whereby he signed for Wealdstone. From Wealdstone he signed on with Aldershot Town where he made over 70 appearances before moving to Swansea City, making his solitary appearance for the Swans against Crystal Palace. He then spent 18 months on loan at Wycombe Wanderers before moving back to Aldershot and then to Farnborough from whom he joined Newport County before returning to Farnborough. From Farnborough this time he was to spend a couple of productive seasons with Havant & Waterlooville before returning to Farnborough last season. Started well for United with a double strike on his debut in a 3-1 victory over Cambridge City, going on to net 9 times in all during the campaign before finding the net 21 times last season where he skipped the side to a landslide promotion. Briefly signed for Moneyfields during the summer months only to return to United midway through August 2019.

GABRIEL PIORKOWSKI - Midfield

18 year-old midfielder who joined Hayes & Yeading in the summer showing well in a pre-season friendly against Cray Wanderers. Started out with Hanwell Town before joining the Staines Town academy under 18 side prior to signing on with the Swans last season, he now comes to United looking to push his career ahead at a senior level. Has already played at the SKYex for Staines Town under 18s against United in 2017.

KYLE DELLA-VERDE - Midfield

24 year-old attacking midfield player who joined Hayes & Yeading in the summer of 2019 having ended the previous campaign with Haringey Borough. Kyle's youth career saw him start with Tottenham before moving to Southend and then Fulham where he signed his first professional contract aged 17 in January 2012 and had a loan spell at Bristol Rovers. After leaving Fulham he signed for Fleetwood Town and then Crawley Town later the same season. At the end of that season he moved into the non-league arena with Welling United from where he moved to Concord Rangers and then Dartford. He started last season in the National League with

Braintree Town before moving for a very brief spell at Kingstonian prior to joining Haringey in March 2019.

OMAR ROWE – Midfield

24 year-old attacking midfielder who joined Hayes & Yeading in August 2019 having last played in Cyprus for Ayia Napa. Spent the first part of his youth career at West Ham United before moving to Southampton at under-16 level where he excelled, signing his professional deal with the Saints on 1 July 2013. Made his Southampton debut in August 2013 as a substitute against Barnsley in the Football League Cup. After the Saints he had short spells with Tower Hamlets, Woodford Town and Bishop's Cleeve before moving to play in Cyprus in 2016. His first side was Ethnikos Latsion before he moved up a division to sign for Ayia Napa. In 2018 he signed for first division side Enosis Neon Paralimni before returning to Ayia Napa in January 2019.

ELLIOT BENYON - Striker

Experienced striker who returned to Hayes & Yeading from Leatherhead in December 2018 having first joined United in January 2015 on loan from Torquay United, playing a large part in United avoiding relegation that season. In August 2015 Elliot re-signed for United on a permanent basis following his release by Torquay, top scoring with 18 goals at season end before opting for a move to neighbours Wealdstone in the summer as United were relegated. Elliot came through the ranks at Bristol City without making an appearance although he did have loan spells with both St Albans and Crawley while with them prior to signing for Torquay United in 2007, making a substitute appearance at Wembley in the 2008 FA Trophy final. Another visit was made to Wembley the following season as the Gulls won promotion back into the Football League from the Conference in a play-off win over Cambridge United. After first leaving Torquay, he played for Swindon, Southend and Wycombe before returning to Torquay in July 2013. Having left United for Wealdstone in the summer of 2016, he then found his way to Leatherhead via short stops at Enfield Town and Whitehawk.

OGO OBI - Striker

Pacey 21 year-old striker who joined Hayes & Yeading just prior to the start of the campaign from fellow Southern Premier South side Hendon. Started out with Watford before joining Cardiff City where he played for the Bluebirds under 23 side before moving to Hampton & Richmond Borough. From Hampton he joined Wealdstone from whom he joined Hendon in January 2019 on dual registration. Was the target for Liverpool and Arsenal as a schoolboy and also had a trial at Louis van Gaal's Manchester United after netting 10 goals in five games for Watford's youngsters in 2013.

DEJON NOEL-WILLIAMS - Striker

20 year-old former Oxford United under 23s striker who joined Hayes & Yeading at the end of August 2019 on a short term loan deal from National League South side Wealdstone. Dejon started out in the youth academy at Watford, a club where his dad Gifton made over 150 appearances, before moving to the youth ranks at Oxford. While at Oxford he had loan spells in the non-league game with Aylesbury United, North Leigh, Abingdon United, Chesham United, Slough Town and Gloucester City before signing with the Stones during the summer of 2019. Comes to United to get more first team games under his belt and further his experience.

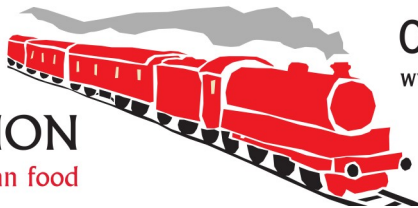
