United stretch their unbeaten run to five

Winslow did just enough to get over the line here on Saturday against a young Huntingdon Town side that almost grabbed a point.

Manager Alex Woodfine was forced into a number of changes due to injuries with Aaron King missing out altogether and George Kerr and Charlie Attwell being left on the bench due to injury concerns. Louie Howarth was looking to continue where he left off from the Burton Park Wanderers game in which he scored four and volleyed over from a Kevin Owusu cross early on and then miscued a similar opportunity from Jack Rowe's cross from the right-hand side.

Simon King hit the post with another effort so it was of little surprise when Winslow took the lead, Owusu teeing up Rowe and he finished with a superb half volley that gave Huntingdon's keeper no chance. Alfie Mumford had to deny Ethan Cox with his feet and Cox then spurned a great chance after Foster crossed as Winslow went into the break with a one-goal advantage which could have been more.

The hosts looked eager to extend their lead after the break with Chris Stapleton heading over from Dylan Riley's deep cross; Cox tested Mumford from range at the other end before United finally got that second goal to double their lead. Matt Ginger was played in by Riley and the former's cross was met at the far post by Rowe whose effort was blocked but fell kindly to Chris Stapleton who comfortably swept home.

Owusu fired over despite being impeded and Ollie Going blasted over at the far post after a Huntingdon corner dropped into his path. Ginger then had a header from Rowe's cross blocked by a defender and the former Grendon man could only hook the loose ball over the bar.

Wes Iroegbu was denied by the keeper as United sought that third goal to kill things off after large periods of control. That third wouldn't come and the visitors gradually crept back into the game: Going played through substitute

Nathan Anyanwu who fired beyond Mumford and Anyanwu had a chance to level but delayed getting his shot off and sub Charlie Attwell was able to block his effort.

Manager Alex Woodfine said after the game: "It's not always perfect and not always pretty but it's another three points and five wins in a row. 19 goals scored and just one conceded!"

Looking forward to tonight's game, Woody said, "Wellingborough have started very well so I'm expecting another tough challenge. If we play how we have started games recently, at a good tempo and functioning as a team, we will be a match for anyone this season."

The visitors...

Wellingborough Whitworth

The club was established in 1973 after London Ideal Clothiers folded, and as most Clothiers players were also playing for the Sunday league team Victoria Millers, Whitworth FC was established.

The new club started in Division One of the Rushden and District League. After winning the Division in 1975–76 and 1976–77, they moved up to the East Midlands Alliance. The club won the league's Munton Cup twice. On the second occasion, both the first team and the reserve teams reached the final, winning 6–1.

After making several improvements to their ground, the club moved up to Division One of the United Counties League in 1985. Since then the club have remained in Division One, twice finishing as runners-up, and winning the division without losing a match in 2006–07.

In the summer of 2013, managers Steve Sargent and Matty Freeman were sacked and replaced by former Flourmen striker James Daldy and his assistant and former professional Tommy Jaszczun.

In the summer of 2013, Whitworth experienced a large turnover of players and eventually finished 17th in Division One in Daldy's first season. During the 2013–14 season Whitworth recorded their record high win, defeating Woodford United 16–0 – a UCL record that still stands.

The Flourmen finished a respectable seventh in the 2014–15 season after threatening promotion for a number of early months.

In January 2015, Whitworth signed 46-year-old former England defender Neil Ruddock, then Daldy departed early into the 2015–16 season and was replaced by his assistant, Tommy Jaszczun for the remainder of the season.

In 2016 James Mallows was appointed manager replacing Jaszczun and The Flourmen were promoted from the United Counties League Division One in the 2016–17 season in Mallows' debut season. The club competed in the United Counties League Premier Division in the 2017–18 season for the first time in their existence and in their first-ever game beat Peterborough Northern Star FC 5–0 away from home.

The Flourmen survived their first season in the UCL Premier on goal difference after beating local rivals Wellingborough Town 3–1 on the final day of the season. The 2018–19 season was tougher for them though as they slipped back into UCL Division One.

In the summer of 2019, Simon Anderson was appointed the first team manager, during the season James Mallows returned to the club as First Team Manager. At the end of the 2020–21 season the club were transferred to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League.

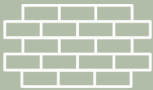
